elcome to the Town of Orange Park-the gateway to Clay County. We are a small, family-oriented town with big city access. Here, we offer more than just a scenic view. Our Town is rich with amenities, activities, and services for residents of any age. Come enjoy our charming small Town that is lined with shady oak tree canopies and tucked in between the St. Johns River and Doctors Lake.

Orange Park is a full-service municipality serving 8,692 residents and over 80,000 visitors that pass by each day. The Town provides top notch police and fire/rescue services. Residents take pride in low crime rates, quick response times, and caring personal service. Our residents enjoy walking tree lined drives and catching up with friends and neighbors at our special events, all in a setting that is maintained to a standard that is unbeatable in the region. Businesses can prosper and grow here with a healthy regional economy and easy access to logistic centers. Our internal administration is here to ensure that things run smoothly and all of your questions are answered. We do all this and more with a dedicated staff of 100!

While progress is part of what we do best, our rich history is just beneath the surface. The Town's roots stretch back to plantation days when landowners like William and Rebecca Pengree and Zephaniah and Anna Jai Kingsley established agricultural footholds here. Their endeavors led to further interest in the area which was soon reachable by steamboat service from Jacksonville to a dock at the end of Kingsley Avenue. Eventually, a rail line and roads brought visitors and



new owners south to bask in the warm climate, start lucrative citrus crops, and enjoy the waters surrounding the Town. From a small community of just over 200 souls in 1900, the Town's population doubled every twenty years until our peak of 9,400 in 1990.

Today, Orange Park is a bustling place for residents, businesses, and travelers. Quick access to the interstate system makes Orange Park an easy commute to Jacksonville's top industries. Jacksonville Naval Air Station, our neighbor to the north, combined with top-rated schools makes Orange Park the perfect place for families to settle both during and after active duty. For travelers, the bulk of Clay County's hotels are in the Town and along with great restaurants, you'll want to stay here for sure! If these reasons weren't enough, we've focused specifically on developing special events that bring the community together. You'll question why you'd ever leave!







What happens when I submit a concern to Town of Orange Park Code Compliance?



COMPLAINT RECEIVED

A complaint is received and a case is opened. If the complaint pertains to another department or agency, it is referred and then closed.

INVESTIGATION

Code Enforcement
Officers conduct an
investigation which may
include performing
research, conducting
interviews, sending
correspondence,
inspecting sites and
making determinations.

ENFORCEMENT*

Enforcement steps may include written warnings, orders to correct, closing or vacating unsafe buildings and enforcement of permits.

HEARING*

Parties may appeal enforcement actions to the magistrate who decides the case and publishes a decision. The process includes case preparation, correspondence, scheduling and holding the hearing, and issuing final notices.

FINAL PROCESSING & CLOSED **

Final processing occurs when the complaint is brought into complainance, unfounded or abated.



- * The Enforcement phase and the hearing phase may not be part of every case, and, after a hearing, a case can transfer back to enforcement.
- ** A case can be closed at any point in the process.

Clarke House Park: Clarke House Park is home to the Clarke House, which is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The house was originally built in 1912 by William Clarke, and serves as a meeting place for the Orange Park Historical Society. The park spans 15 acres and facilities include the playground, sand volleyball court, nature trails, gardens, lake, three pavilions, grills, restrooms, and numerous beautiful oak trees. The park is a popular spot for birthday parties and family events. The pavilions are available to rent. Located at 1039 Kingsley Ave, Orange Park, FL.



Kingsley East River Overlook: Kingsley East River Overlook is a pocket park in the public right-of-way at the east end of Kingsley Avenue overlooking the St. John's River. Enjoy the panoramic river views, read about torpedo use during the Civil War or walk down River Road. Parking is available along Kingsley Avenue.

Orange Park Skateboard Park: The Orange Park Skateboard Park is the only skateboard facility in all of Clay County. It is owned by the Town of Orange Park and operated by the Orange Park Patrons, a not-for-profit entity. Skateboards and in-line skates are permitted at the park. Skaters under 16 must wear an approved helmet. Other facilities at the skate park include a playground, a nature trail, and a pavilion. It Starts in Parks

Somer's Sunshine Park: Spurred by the tragic story of Somer Thompson, the Town Council dedicated a one-acre parcel of land as a park that would bear Somer's name, and provide a peaceful place to spend time with family and friends. Business owners and residents rallied together and donated approximately \$25,000 in labor and materials. Community members and local organizations gathered in March 2012 to put the finishing touches on the park, which includes a walking trail, butterfly garden, shade trees, picnic areas and benches. Somer's Sunshine Park is a shining testimony to the spirit, unity and dedication of the Orange Park community. Located at the intersection of Gano Ave and DeBarry Ave, Orange Park, FL.



T.C. Miller Community Center & Recreational Park: The T.C. Miller Center is the site of a historic elementary school and is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. This original structure was built in 1938 by the Clay County School Board as an African-American school. It is now home to the Clay County Youth Character Building Program, which provides vital youth services to children in the community. The community center is also available for rent for special occasions. Public facilities include a pavilion, also available for rent, full size basketball court, newly installed playground, and restrooms. Located at 440 McIntosh Ave, Orange Park, FL.

Town Hall Park: Town Hall Park facilities include an inclusive playground, picnic tables, band stage and restrooms. The playground features a rubberized surface, wheelchair swing, and the areas first expression swing! Many community events are held in the park each year, including the popular Fall Festival and Farmer's & Arts Market! The park is available for rent for non-profit organization events. Located at 2042 Park Ave, Orange Park, FL.



Park Rental Information

Looking for the perfect spot to host a birthday party, baby shower, or family reunion? The Town has several picnic pavilions available to rent as well as an indoor community center.

Clarke House Park on Kingsley has three pavilions available each with six large picnic tables and a barbeque grill. Reservations can be made by visiting TownOfOrangePark.com and clicking on the pavilion rental button in the center of the page. The three pavilions are:

- Pecan Grove (P1) which is closest to the playground
- Beach Bay (P2) which is next to the volleyball court
- Bamboo Lake (P3) which is behind the Clarke House. This pavilion offers the most privacy.

Each pavilion can be rented in 4-hour time blocks year-round from 9:00am - 1:00pm or 1:00pm - 5:00pm. Between April and September, rentals can also be made from 5:00pm - sunset. Each 4-hour block is \$50 + tax. Residents of the Town get a 50% rental discount.

The TC Miller Park also has a rentable pavilion as well as a community center. The pavilion can be rented through the Town's website and the time blocks and rates are the same as at Clarke House Park. The center and pavilion are rented separately.

The Community Center is rented by the day and can be rented any day of the week. The center has a capacity of 40 persons and includes a full kitchen, ten tables and 40 chairs. The daily rate is \$200 for non-residents and \$75 for Town residents. These rates do not include tax or the refundable \$100 deposit. The Community Center is available from mid-August to mid-May and is the home of the Youth Character Building Camp during the summer.



The History of Orange Park, Florida

Daniel McGirt

Most of us are familiar with McGirts Creek, the small, tidal creek that flows along the Clay County -Duval County line before turning north and widening into the Ortega River. The creek was named for an early resident of the region, Daniel McGirt, who came to prominence during the American Revolution and incurred the wrath of both the British and Spanish governments after the war. His reputation for raid and plunder was such that many criminal acts were attributed to him whether he committed them or not. Today we might consider McGirt a colorful character but, to many people in East Florida and Georgia during the late 1700's, the only color that came to mind was red, as in anger or blood!

The following information was derived from several sources and provides an overview of McGirt's life. Accounts vary and some records are not clear but McGirt proved to be an opportunistic criminal that thrived on conflict and lax enforcement of the law.

Daniel McGirt was born near Camden, South Carolina around 1750 to James and Priscilla McGirt. His family was well-established in the Camden area. Young McGirt received little, if any, formal education. As he grew into adulthood, he became a skilled backwoodsman, adept at hunting and tracking. When the American Revolution began, Daniel McGirt aligned himself with the American cause. Due to his knowledge of the countryside, he became a scout for American militia forces.


In 1776, McGirt was serving with an American militia force traveling through Georgia with the intent of attacking a British fort on the Florida side of the St. Marys River. The mission failed because of actions attributed to Daniel McGirt. One version relates that an American officer coveted McGirt's horse. When McGirt proved unwilling to trade his horse to the officer it led to an altercation between the two. McGirt was court-martialed, convicted of striking an officer, and sentenced to three public whippings. After the first whipping, McGirt managed to escape, with his horse, then join British forces to seek his revenge. A less noble version of

the story states that McGirt simply deserted his post one night, taking many of the militia's horses with him to the British side. Regardless of which version is true, the American mission came to an end and they withdrew from the region leaving it open to British control. As for the British, they were duly impressed with McGirt, received him with open arms and appointed him a Lieutenant Colonel in Thomas Brown's East Florida Rangers.

McGirt became an effective and ruthless raider for the British

as he and his men, a collection of rough, disaffected backwoodsmen, escaped slaves and Indians, terrorized plantations in Georgia and lower South Carolina. McGirt led or participated in a number of raids in both colonies terrorizing inhabitants, destroying property and robbing plantations of valuables including slaves, livestock, precious metals and provisions. When McGirt was known to be in a particular area, men would not leave their families and homes unprotected, making it impossible to raise militia forces. In the absence of organized militia, McGirt could easily raid the plantations he deemed most profitable.

In 1780, the focus of the American Revolution turned south and the British army in South Carolina occupied the attention of most American forces. McGirt took full advantage of the situation. His appetite for plunder had increased and he raided American and British plantations indiscriminately. Because he was still useful in disrupting American forces in the backcountry, the British tolerated him as long as they could. When they could no longer turn a blind eye to his attacks on Loyalist plantations, they posted a reward of \$50 for his capture. However, with British and American interests focused elsewhere, McGirt eluded capture for the rest of the war.

Near the conclusion of the war, McGirt established a farm on land that is now occupied by the Venetia neighborhood and the north end of the Naval Air Station in Jacksonville. This land borders McGirt's Creek to the east and its connection to Daniel McGirt is how the creek got its name. McGirt was not suited to the life of a gentleman farmer. With the signing of the Treaty of Paris, it became known to all British residents that East Florida would be ceded back to Spain. McGirt took advantage of the transition to continue the raids at which he was so effective during the Revolutionary War, except this time he raided plantations in East Florida.

Prior to the transfer of power to Spain, British forces arrested McGirt and imprisoned him in the Castillo de San Marcos in St. Augustine. He escaped and continued his raids on local plantations. After the Spanish assumed control of East Florida, McGirt was arrested again in 1785 and transferred to Havana. He was soon given his freedom and allowed to keep his property provided he settled outside of Spanish territory. McGirt

was on his way to settle in the Bahamas when he changed his mind and made his way back to East Florida. He was caught once again and deported to the Bahamas.

Years of hard living and incarceration took its toll on McGirt's health. While the record on McGirt's later years aren't quite clear it is likely that he abandoned his outlaw life and returned to South Carolina to rejoin his wife and quietly live out his days on her brother's plantation under a well-concealed identity. McGirt died around 1804.

While McGirt often struck fear and anger in the hearts of many, there are accounts of acts of great loyalty to his family and friends. This in no way excuses his criminal activities but his life illuminates the risks and rewards of living and surviving on the semilawless frontier of Florida and Georgia in the late 18th century.

Play Ball! The Story of the Orange Park Athletic Association

In the 1950s when a group of boys wanted to play baseball, they could go to the open field on Moosehaven property and play until their moms called them in for supper. It was great fun and drew the attention of some Moose retirees who enjoyed the zeal of youth. By the 1960s there were just too many kids in Orange Park for that arrangement. They needed a larger space.

In March of 1962, Mr. Robert Griffin offered to sell some of his land to make a ball park. After a little bargaining the town agreed to buy 6.5 acres for \$2850. The process of getting the land surveyed and ready took too long. The boys were anxious to play. So, in April of 1963, the first Little League games started at Orange Park Elementary's field instead. Mr. Griffin made another offer to the town for more of his land. Meanwhile an Orange Park Little League Board of Directors was assembled for competitive baseball, led by Buck Murphy, Bob Nolan, Barney Clark and Dick Fromhart.

The Orange Park Athletic Association (OPAA) was launched on May 3, 1963 at a dedication ceremony hosted by Glenn Alred of the Lion's Club, Mayor Walter Odom, Reverend Gene McCullough of the First Baptist Church and Bob Nolan, Town Manager and coach. A constitution and by-laws were adopted. The driving force behind all this was Dick Fromhart, for whom the street would later be named.

Finally, in December of 1965 the Town of Orange Park purchased the land west of Fromhart St. from Griffin. Land and service negotiations went back and forth for another year. In December of 1966 the Town Council agreed to a 10year lease with Little League of Orange Park. Inc. However, some games were still played at Orange Park Elementary.

Games began to be played on the Fromhart property in 1968, starting with two fields and one concrete building in which to store gear. Originally baseball was played in the spring and football in the winter. They were played on the same fields at first. John Davis and Dick Shipley are responsible for getting the football teams playing. By 1969 four softball teams were added to the mix.

The Athletic Association drew a lot of attention. A concession stand was added which was considered a very big deal at the time. A swimming pool was added to the site but had a lot of problems so after a while it was filled in and that area remains vacant. OPAA remains a vital presence in Orange Park. The town has added a playground (called Gano Park) and other features.

In 2002 OPAA dedicated a new football field to Dick Shipley (above) for thirty years of dedication to the organization. Shipley was "Coach" to generations. Similarly, a field was named to honor John Davis who also gave three decades of devotion. The 1987 Cyclones coached by John Davis and Dick Shipley won the Pop Warner Conference title, something no other Orange Park team did




for the next fourteen years.

Decades of fun and fellowship developed from OPAA teams. In 2017, past coaches, board members, and players formed an Alumni group to advocate on behald of their former fields of play. They have a Facebook page (https://www.facebook.com/Orange-Park-Athletic-Association-Alumni-732611916904048/) to highlight current and past activities. Some of these men were once those tenyear-olds sliding into home on the 1950's Moosehaven grounds.





Currently, the fire department holds an ISO rating of 3/3x, which is in the top 12% of departments that are rated. We started to provide Emergency Medical Service transports for the Town and surrounding areas in October 2019.

After a child nearly drowned in a family member's pool, we started an initiative of doing pool safety checks for homeowners in the Town.

Additionally, we promote several community outreach programs. During Kids Fest, kids could participate in a junior firefighter academy and could perform similar firefighter tasks. The department sponsors an Explorer Post for teens interested in Fire/EMS careers. We offer fire extinguisher training and fire drills to are community business partners. We use a fire safety trailer during fire prevention week to teach children fire safety and other training programs. The most popular annual hometown community event is the Santa fire truck parade. Those are just a few ways we stand out as a community focused agency.
