Middleburg is an unincorporated area and census-designated place (CDP) in Clay County. It began in the 1820s first as Clark's Ferry, named for the man who ran the local ferry. From 1833 to 1850, the area was known as Gary's Ferry. Then in 1853, it officially became Middleburg. When Clay County was created in 1858, Middleburg became the county seat until 1874.

One of the largest areas of Clay County, Middleburg includes both rural and small town areas and is fast growing as a center of commerce and recreation. With access to Black Creek and Doctors Lake, the area boasts great fishing, boating and water sports activities. The beautiful Jennings State Forest offers plenty of outdoor activities including hiking, horseback riding, and canoeing.

Middleburg also is home to St. Vincent's Medical Center Clay County, a full-service hospital that recently added maternity and women's services, more ER rooms and 30 additional inpatient beds.

Middleburg Civic Association

Starting in 1937

On April 19, 1937 Mr. and Mrs. F.W. Budington deeded a parcel of land 150 feet by 200 feet on Palmetto Avenue to the Clay County Commissioners to be used as the ground upon which a Canning Center and Recreation Hall was to be erected for the citizens of Middleburg and for no other purpose. The property, as stipulated in the deed, was not to be used for any school purposes what-so-ever.

The building and original furniture was built by WPA workers and on Nov. 15, 1938, a committee held its first meeting to make rules and regulations for a "Community Home." Those attending this meeting were: Mr. and Mrs. A.W. Budd, Mr. and Mrs. Joe Masters, Mrs. Alice Masters, Mrs. Gussie Stewart. Mrs. Pearl Lee. Mrs. F.W. Budington, Mr. Joe Huntley and Mr. L.E. Ganann. Mr. Budd was selected Chairman and it was voted that anyone using the building would pay 50 cents, with an additional 25 cents as a guarantee that the building would be left clean and in good condition, this amount to be refunded when said conditions are complied with and accepted by the committee in charge. There was an additional charge of 50 cents if lights were used.

It was not until July 1941 that a temporary Executive Committee met for the purpose of forming a corporation and drawing up by-laws. The name was changed from The Community Home to The Middleburg Civic Association. The original sign, made by James McDonald, still hangs over the steps. The proposed Charter was approved,



as presented, by Hon. A.D. McNeil, Circuit Judge of the Fourth Judicial Circuit of Florida on July 14, 1941 in Jacksonville. On July 15, 1941 said charter was filed with Mr. L.T. Ivey, Clerk Circuit Court, Clay County. There were eight specific objects and purposes for which the corporation was organized. They were:

- To promote the literary, scientific, social and philosophical improvement, advancement and benefit of its members.
- 2. To render aid to all worthy civic objects and purposes

- 3. To promote the general development of the Community of Middleburg, Clay County, Florida.
- 4. To cultivate public sentiment for the promotion of civic improvement and beautification of the community.
- 5. To develop the mutual welfare and benefit of its members.
- To cooperate with and to assist in coordinating efforts of all similar organizations and individuals for the promotion of the civic benefit of the Community of Middleburg,
- 7. To own, maintain and operate a Community House in Middleburg with the full power to leave the building or equipment, to purchase equipment, furniture, fixtures and supplies and to promote meetings, dances, entertainments and other civil meetings and to charge admission.
- 8. To cooperate in all aspects with the Clay County Chamber of Commerce and the Board of Clay County Commssioners.

The opening date was set for September 10, 1941 and a concert was to be given.







What a change the Middleburg Museum has undergone in the last year! In the spring of 2020 we began packing up the contents of the museum to make room to work. And boy did we ever work hard! Between having seven yard sales to raise money and awareness, replacing carpet with new floors, painting the walls and rearranging the entire place, it was quite a series of tasks. Although we officially reopened at the Historical Festival in the fall of 2020, there has still been lots of work happening as displays are put back together, and new treasures are brought in from the community. We also attained our 501(c)3 status, which enables us to apply for grants. This was a huge step for the museum, and a goal attained that has been on the "to do list" for twenty years. There is a new crop of volunteers that help cover our regular Sunday hours, as well as members from the past thirty years who are still involved and keeping us going strong. We have plans to open on some Saturdays in the future, as well as weekdays here and there.

In case you've never been, the museum is located at 3912 Section St. here in Middle-

burg. Nestled between the Civic Association Building and the Senior Center, it's a small building that was built as a community canning factory by the WPA in 1938. However, there weren't enough funds for the canning equipment itself and the building was used in many different ways over the years as a storage facility, vaccinations center, and place to watch movies on the weekends with friends. In 1989 the Civic Association helped to create the Middleburg Museum, and over the years it became its own entity. It is divided into two sections, with the first half showing displays of economy and history relevant to the area. The other half is a replication of a 1850's home with a kitchen, parlor, and bedroom. It's a charming little place and I certainly hope you will come visit us and enjoy all the hard work that has been put in by the community this year. We are also on Facebook as The Middleburg Museum and will have an Instagram account up and running soon. Stop in one Sunday or follow us on Social Media to find out what extra days we will be open.

she had neither control nor input into who won. That decision rests with the judges.





JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (May 24, 2021) — A team of three freshman students from Middleburg High School won "Best Technical Approach" in the ACE Mentor Program



of Northeast Florida's regional competition this year.

The annual contest challenges local high school students to design a building and develop a proposal in response to a mock request for proposal (RFP). On April 30, the student teams presented their projects virtually to a panel of expert judges.

The winning "Middleburg Middlebuilders" team consists of:

- Kamryn Wright, freshman ("Project Architect")
- Connor Tison, freshman ("Architectural Designer")
- Daniel Lee, freshman ("Electrical Engineer")

The Middleburg High students won over the judges with their design of a tiny home that met the RFP specifications and aligned with the surrounding community and environment. The students competed against 10 other teams from five area high schools, including a homeschool team.

"This was a challenging year for the program as weekly sessions had to be held virtually, but these students persevered," said Chise Nicholson, an architectural associate at Stellar and the team's ACE Mentor Lead. "They are all first-timers to the ACE Mentor Program and showed tremendous growth since the beginning of the program year. I'm amazed at their hard work and the excellent project they completed — and clearly the judges were, too."

The winning students are certified users in a number of industry-standard software programs used by professional designers such as Autodesk AutoCAD, Revit and Inventor. The team's Teacher Lead was Middleburg High faculty member Michael Carson, and Mike Ackley of Mattamy Homes served as a supporting mentor.

Founded during the 2006-2007 school year, the ACE Mentor Program of Northeast Florida helps high school students explore potential careers in architecture, construction and engineering. Through the program, mentors from local industry firms meet with students once a week for 18-20 weeks. During these sessions, students work in teams to create practical solutions for "real-world" projects.

Stellar has long been a supporter of architecture, engineering and construction education within the community. The firm partnered to create the Stellar Academy of Engineering at Nease High School, which is now in its 15th year. The program provides students with an innovative curriculum and includes opportunities to learn from Stellar experts in the classroom and beyond. Stellar also supports college scholarships for Academy students as well as for local high school seniors participating in the ACE Mentor Program.

MIDDLEBURG - Middleburg High golfer Chase Carroll and cross country runner Emma Mussante both chased the dream of going to the state championships with both finishing their respective seasons with strong endings.

Carroll, who as a freshman, got a first ticket to the Class 2A championship tournament last year, kept his canny knack of opportunistic golf to kind of ride under the radar of more prominent golfers in the area to storm to the region 1-2A title and put his name in the hopper with the likes of golfers from Bishop Kenyy, Pensacola and Ponte Vedra; the region team champion with Bishop Kenny third.

At the state meet, Carroll struggled the first round then nearly turned his game around, but eventually finished 35th with rounds of 82 and 79.

Carroll's brother, Cody, now a golfer for the University of North Florida, remains the family's lone state golf champion.

At the state meet, in super hilly Tallahassee, Bing would finish 10th, Barber would finish in 18th and Mussante would finish 24th to close out a career of an always-improving four years topped with a scholarship offer from Florida Southern College.

In the winter season, girls soccer dominated the headlines with coach Kenneth Yancey extracting a district runnerup finish and a final 11-7-2 record behind scrappy play up front from Molly Burt

In girls weightlifting, Leslie Catlett, Jewel Taylor and Emily Georgiades get-







ting state meet tickets.

Spring sports saw feisty coach and athletic director John Stilianou raising the bar of excellence in flag football for Bronco fans with a astute quarterback; Brooke Swenson, a wispy tailback in Meghan Bonser and defensive stalwarts Jewel Taylor, Desiree Hall and and glue-fingered pass interceptor Cheyenne Jenkins putting Middleburg on the playoff map with a region playoff run.

On the track, freshman Nya Russell put the track scene on notice in the long jump with a state bid while sophomore discus thrower Wyatt Underwood got his first shot at the state meet.

Both the softball and baseball team made season-ending playoff noise with the Lady Broncos getting to the region final with pseudo-upsets over Deltona, Matanzas and an near-miss against Pace High in the region championship.

Baseball had a late big bat run, but fell short in the regions to eventual region finalist Ponte Vedra in round one.

In weightlifting, Stone Newsome duked it out with Suwannee eventual state champion with a 1-2 finish at region by just a 0.1 pound difference in body weight giving Jaquez Moore the region title. Moore also won the state title at 183 with getting injured. Johnathan Floyd, at 169, was third in region and fourth at state.

Biggest news for 2021 is new football coach Ryan Wolfe who will inject a fast-moving offense to the Bronco gridiron as was evident in a 21-0 win over Keystone Heights in their spring game.

The Three Houses of Chalker

The Chalker Family of Middleburg is perhaps one of our most important pioneer families in Clay County. Arriving here in the early 1850's, they became an integral part of the community and left their mark on the Main Street Historic District of Middleburg.

Albert Symington Chalker was from Horry County, South Carolina. In 1852, when he was just nine years old, he moved with his parents and siblings to Clay County, Florida. When he was nineteen, Chalker joined the Company K of the Second Florida Cavalry. He spent much of his time at Baldwin, Florida, and served as a courier for General Joseph Finegan.

During the war, Chalker carried on a romance via the mail with Martha Ann Bardin. His beautiful love letters are preserved at the State Archives and are available online at Florida Memory. When he was not romancing Martha, he wrote about the conditions under which he was serving. He married Martha Ann Bardin in December 1865. Martha's father, William Sims Bardin, gave his Middleburg residence to the couple as a wedding gift. Chalker first established a ferry on the south prong of Black


Creek. The ferry helped transport produce to market and prospered. Next, he built a general store on Main Street. For seventeen years, Albert Chalker served as Middleburg's postmaster and tax collector from 1881 to 1885.



Around 1890, Chalker went out west to New Mexico, where he hoped to expand his fortune. There, he was diagnosed with Bright's disease, a kidney ailment. He returned to Middleburg, where he died on January 26, 1906. Martha Anne Chalker lived at the Clark-Chalker House until her death in 1936.

From the National Register of Historic Places: "The most historically significant building in the district is the Clark-Chalker House located at 3891 Main Street. The Clark-Chalker House is one of Florida's few surviving antebellum period houses, and was listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1988. Constructed circa 1935 when Middleburg became a staging area for military operations during the Second Seminole War, it is the oldest extant building in Middleburg (and Clay County). The house was probably built at the behest of Captain Michael M. Clark, Quartermaster at nearby Fort Heileman, who in 1835 was instructed to construct buildings necessary to facilitate the prosecution of the war. The building likely served as headquarters for Generals Winfield Scott and Thomas Jessup. There is also evidence suggesting that it was used as an army hospital during the conflict. In 1845, Isaac Varnes purchased the property, and in turn, sold it to the Hoyt Family who operated a private school for planters' children out of the house. In 1859, William Sims Bardin acquired the house and surrounding land along the south fork of Black Creek. Bardin was born in 1817 near Picolata, Florida. He served as a soldier







in the Second Seminole War (1835-1842). After the war, Bardin turned to farming land in the vicinity of Middleburg which he had inherited from his father. It was land which his father had bought in 1826. Bardin's daughter, Martha Anne, began attending the Hoyt School in 1851. Desiring to be closer to his daughter and his land holdings, he purchased the property from the Hoyt's in 1859. By 1860, Bardin owned thirty-five slaves and had established a thriving plantation along the banks of the Black Creek. During the Civil War the Bardin house fared better than some of the other buildings in Middleburg. Although plundered of its furniture, the house itself was not damaged. Bardin's plantation, however, was virtually destroyed. At the close of hostilities, Martha Anne Bardin married Albert Symington Chalker, a cavalry soldier whom she had met during the war. William Bardin gave the newlyweds the house on Main Street as a wedding gift."

Martha's grandson, Dr. Francis Allen Copp, inherited the house and embarked on a significant restoration effort. The most profound alteration was on the front facade, where Dr. Copp removed the second-story gallery and added a small balcony and four masonry columns across the front in its place.


In the 1980s, the home was purchased by the Gaudet Family and was their primary

residence until the early 1990s. At some point, the historic Knights of Pythias lodge was moved to the Chalker property. It was restored and served as a part-time residence for the family until both properties were sold in the early 1990s.

Next, located at 3895 Main Street, right next door to the Clark Chalker house and the Masonic lodge, was one of two George A Chalker houses. George Albert was the son of Albert and Martha Chalker. He was a successful businessman in his own right, and was the postmaster for a period like his father. He owned a mercantile store on Main Street. He was involved in Scotland Mills and the Middleburg Lumber Company. In 1903, he travelled to New York on behalf of Scotland Mills. His partners in the Middleburg Lumber Co. were Edward and

Lincoln Spencer. He also had a real estate development company, and the company built the home at 3895 Main Street. It eventually became known as the Stewart house.

George Chalker's private home is found at 2160 Wharf Street, right around the corner from the other two houses. In January 1897, George purchased the lot from the Florida National Bank. The price was \$100. The original style of the house was Folk Victorian, featuring decorative spindle work and verge board in the gable ends, and a tiered front-end porch. In about 1910, however, the building was remodeled using the then popular contemporary Colonial Revival style. The building remained in the Chalker Family until it was sold to Elmer Edinfield in 1969.

- Our members volunteer as Salvation Army Bell Ringers to assist Salvation Army raise funds for its mission in Clay County.

Middleburg woman is the driving force behind annual toy for Florida National Guard families



Christmas is coming to Clay in a few months and Jeanne Scholl already is collecting toys for the holiday season. Although she is not an elf, Scholl is working hard to make sure all military families have toys for Christmas.

Scholl started collecting toys after she saw a need in her community.

"My family and I had started donating toys locally, mainly because when I was growing up my father was always about 'Christmas is for the kids'..." Scholl said. "And so through my life there were a lot of

times where I couldn't provide for my kids. And so I always told myself, you know I've always had good people that were just there. They just always helped me and I'm going to do the same. I just have to."

Scholl started the nonprofit charity, Operation Santa Cause, in 2013. Operation Santa Cause focuses on children of National Guard members and gold star families in the Clay County area. At first, Scholl and her family were buying the toys with their

own money but would later start receiving toy donations. Jeanne and Bernie Scholl connected with Jeanne's fellow coworker Kathleen Weise, and together they founded Operation Santa Cause.

Scholl likes to keep things a secret that she's working for Santa by giving the parents the toys in December. They never see the children and only the parents are aware of the promotion. While Scholl loves to keep the process a secret and something exciting for the children, she sometimes wishes she could see their reactions.

"One of the Gold Star mothers shared a story with us that just warmed our hearts because we don't get to hear too many stories

So that way he knows that even though his dad has passed he knows that the guard is still watching over him and



THE FROSARD BUDINGTON HOME

(Circa 1910) 3916 Main Street
This is Historic Middleburg's only example of
Queen Anne architecture. It is unusual in that
it is a single story with a rounded corner on the
veranda porch. The rounded columns are called
ionic. The interesting shape of the left-hand
gable window when facing the front of the
house is called Palladian. In 1927, Mr. and Mrs.
F. Budington gave a deed to the Middleburg
United Methodist Church which later added
the Budington Educational Building. This home
is now owned by Mrs. Pat Mueller.

THE HOUSES



UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

(Circa 1847) 3925 Main Street
This building is one of the oldest Methodist churches in continuous use in Florida. It is a frame vernacular Church built of Hand-wrought lumber and nails. Mr. George Branning later donated the bell which was forged in New York and shipped by steamboat. One early use of the bell was to toll the death of his son, Robert Branning, who died in 1861 at 20 years of age.




THE STEWART HOME

(Circa 1890-1911) 3895 Main Stree
This is Middleburg's only example of center gable
frame vernacular architecture. It is a white two-story
home with a porch. It has a front facing gable wall
dormer window. The home was built by George
Chalker. As Mr. Chalker had a home on wharf
Street, he rented this house to Mr. and Mrs. G.P,
Stewart. The Stewarts moved from the Gin House
Landing area where they had a turpentine mill.



THE BUDINGTON HOME

(Circa Late 1800's)
Originally at 3913 Main Street
This is a white two-story house with a wide L-shaped porch which extends out to an area which can be used now as a carport. The shutters on this home are functional. This frame vernacular home is thought to have been moved to its present sit by rolling it on logs from across the street where the F. Budington home is now. This home is simpler in appearance on the outside than the Frosard Budington house across the street. This house has been relocated to the Main Street Park.



THE GEORGE CHALKER HOME

(Circa Late 1800's) 2160 Wharf Street
This white two-story home sits on a large area of land. It is
Colonial Revival architecture which features a flat roofed
porch with a railing above which is supported by square
columns. There is a dormer window on the roof on the
front of the house. A vine-covered retaining wall fronts the
home on Wharf Street. The Chalker family was related to
many families in Middleburg. It is presently under-going
renovation and restoration.



DR. G.E. ADAMS & DR. STONE HOME

(Circa Early 1900's) 2145 Wharf Street
This building is a small frame vernacular
home. It has decorative wooden trim on it.
There is wooden "gingerbread" trim at the top
of the porch columns. The porch with railing is
on the left side of the house when facing the
front. This building served as a Doctor's office
and home in 1914. Later, the house became a
private residence.



THE GEORGE HASKELL HOME

(Circa Late 1800's) 3894 Main Street
This frame vernacular home was built by Mr. Haskell
as a replica of his home in Salem Mass. He was stationed with the Union troops during the Civil War in
the area. He was attached to the Paymaster Corps. He
later acquired 500 acres of land. The house is three
stories and has been remodeled and kept in good
condition. It is white with a decorative eagle on it.

THE CLARK-CHALKER HOUSE

(Circa 1835) 3891 Main Street
This is the oldest building in Middleburg. It is a white two-story columned house with a white picket fence.
This open side gable frame vernacular home was built for Capt. Matthew Clark and his staff. They were with the U.S. 2nd Dragoons stationed at Ft Heilman. During the Second Seminole Indian war, the house was headquarters for General Winfield Scott. Martha Ann Chalker later occupied the house for 82 years until her death in 1936.



OLD MASONIC LODGE

(Circa Late 1800-1889) 3893 Main Street
This building was moved to its present site
from where the present Masonic Lodge is now.
It is often called "the old lodge." It has an open
side gable frame vernacular building built
in the federal-period style. It has a one bay
gable roof entrance porch on the east side. This
yellow painted two-story building is balanced
or symmetrical in appearance. It is beside the
Clark-Chalker house.



THE HADDEN HOME

(Circa 1912) 3887 Main Street
This is a colonial revival home with a balanced
front called a symmetrical façade. This is a
two-story home with round columns. It has a
tin roof like several of the historic homes in
the historic district. An interesting aspect of
this home is that the decoration above the
front door was originally made from an old
bed headboard. This is called a decorative
entrance Pediment.



THE BARTHLOW HOME

(Circa 1800's) 3884 Main Street
This is a frame vernacular home, which is a typical wood
frame home of the period. It is a small home with a tin
roof and green metal awnings over the porch. Homes
during this period were built with fireplaces for heat as is
this one. This home has a metal fence. Some of the other
homes have wooden, brick, metal or stone fences in front
of their homes. Some do not have fences. This home
remains in the Barthlow family to this day.



THE BARDIN HOME

(Circa 1888) 3881 Main Street
This is Middleburg's only example of Italian architecture. This style is more common in other areas of the country that in the South. There is a central cupola which is a small structure built on to the house. It is often used as a lookout and for air supple ventilation. Mr. Henry Bardin's house has two wide porches across the front of the hoe. It also has Victorian style gingerbread trim. The Bardins used to have square

dances there many Saturday nights.




LONG HOUSE

(Circa 1890) 3858 Main Street
This home was purchased by
Edward Long for his parents
in 1896. It was an example of
the open side gamble frame
vernacular style. This building
features drop siding exterior
wall fabric and an exterior field
stone chimney stack.





The Stevens family remembers every smile at their walkup window at Dreamette Ice Cream, from the innocent looks of anticipation from children to the glances of grandparents who still reminiscence of a time when such simple pleasures defined a day.

The parents started the business as an investment for their son, Matthew. They plan to turn over the business, sprinkles and all, and return to retirement.

"The amazing thing is seeing a family enjoying some ice cream and all the phones are in their pockets," Matthew said. "It's a real family moment. You don't see a lot of that anymore."

The store is located at 2620 Blanding Blvd. at the Middleburg Crossings. To keep things simple, the corner store only offers walkup



service, and it only accepts cash.

The menu includes all flavors of ice cream and dairy treats. It doesn't sell chili dogs, onion rings or chicken tenders. Dreamette is known for its ice cream, so that's all they do.

"In a world of COVID, it's nice when a family can get out and spend about \$12 for ice cream," Mark said. "That's a wonderful feeling."
