Adams pleads guilty

Lake Asbury man enters guily plea for stealing government property, aggravated idenity theft

JACKSONVILLE – A Lake Asbury man accused of burying his mother in the backyard of her home at least two years ago, pleaded guilty Monday in federal court in Jacksonville.

United States Attorney A. Lee Bentley III said Brian Lee Adams, 56, pleaded guilty to theft of government property and aggravated identity theft on Oct. 31 in

U.S. District Court in Jacksonville. He faces a maximum penalty of 12 years in federal prison, including a mandatory two-year sentence for aggravated identity theft. A sentencing date has not yet been set. According to



the plea agreement, Adams admitted to authorities that his mother had died of natural causes in July 2014 and, instead of notifying anyone, Adams buried her in the backyard of her home in the 2000 block of Creekfront Drive near Ronnie Van Zant Park in Lake Asbury.

Adams confessed to investigators that he had buried his mother after she died in order to continue collecting both her Social Security payments and a pension pay-

Hendry and Klinzman

Two newcomers battle for District 5 seat

ORANGE PARK – Two political newcomers are vying to fill County Comission Vice

Chairman Ronnie Robinson's shoes after he is term limited out of office this year.

Republican retired sheriff's deputy Gayward Hendry, 69, and Independent retired scientist Richard Klinzman, 65, proceeded through the Aug. 30 primary without opposition, but must now compete for voter major-

Hendry, has raised more than \$36,000 since he began his campaign in October 2015. Klinzman's campaign, entirely

self-funded, began in March. He has since raised slightly more than \$5,000.

School founded in 1891 to finally get proper recognition

ORANGE PARK — By unanimous vote, the Orange Park Town Council approved a motion Tuesday to place a historical marker where the Orange Park Normal and Industrial School once stood, a school that was anything but normal in its time.

When Orange Park's Normal School opened October 7, 1891, it was the only place where both white and black students could learn together under the same roof in the Florida. Council members now want to honor the school with a monument where it once stood

As part of the town's vote, a special fund for donations will open for the monument, which is still in the planning. To jumpstart donations, the town will use \$3,750 previously budgeted to hire a new public works mechanic at the start of the year.

"I was very taken by the whole story about the Normal School," said Council member Connie Thomas. "We want to celebrate diversity and come together."

Thomas intends to work with state archivists to certify that Orange Park Normal School was perhaps the only integrated school of its time in the state of Florida.

The school – founded and operated by the New York-based American Missionary Association –was certainly ahead of its time. Ten instructors migrated from the north to teach curricula centered on core classes such as grammar, educational sermons and industrial necessities such as drafting.

The school rested among acres of oak and orange trees and hanging Spanish moss near where town hall, vast networks of roads and fast food restaurants now sit.

During this time, Florida's Jim Crow laws harbored some of the harshest penalties in the country. For instance, blacks and whites who entered a railroad car reserved for the other race could be sentenced to the pillory or whipped 39 times – or both.

Florida also rewarded informants \$500 for reporting cases of miscegenation, proof that xenophobia was rampant, lucrative and well-received in the community.

There were already laws in place prohibiting blacks and whites from learning in the same place, but these did not apply to private schools. AMA missionaries – then the most outspoken advocates for black

education – started the school promoting the inclusion of all races.

The AMA intended to "nourish a healthy growth, so far as we shall have the means to do so, and send out new influences from this school which shall be educative and

helpful for a large section of the country," according to a report by Florida State University History Professor Joe M. Richardson, who has written at length about the

Aside from a short stint on the county's charter review commitssion, Klinzman has no experience in politics. He said his decision to run came in part from a desire to add another party voice to the overwhelming single party voice present in Clay County. All five sitting commissioners are Republicans and with Chairman Diane Hutchings' unopposed re-election and Republican Mike Cella's election as District 1 commissioner – the majority is unlikely to change soon.

"It's like Republican Legos," Klinzman said. "When one gets popped out they just pop another one right in. I got pretty tired of the single party rule. Every single elected office is held by Republicans and Republicans in office are only talking to Republicans."

Hendry's bid comes as somewhat of an extension to his comprehensive laundry list of public service positions he's held in Clay County over the years, ranging from Clay County Historical Society president to Clay County Education Foundation Chair-

man.

Hendry has experience operating budgets as the president of the Clay County Farm Bureau, as well as experience he gained serving on the Clay County Planning and Zoning Commission.

Infrastructure, taxes and overregulation

Without any standout political experience, most of the two candidate's ideas for improving the county come from years of living here. Klinzman suggested controlling the expansion of housing developments to catch up with improvements to infrastructure. Klinzman said traffic is a countywide problem. He suggests the county take advantage of this year's uptick in taxable property values to fulfill needs not addressed during the Great Recession, such as building roads.

Klinzman said he would support a millage rate increase to 8.8 to bring the county millage rate back to what it was before the 2008 recession. The current tax rate for most of the county is 8.1010.

One mill equates to \$1 in tax revenue for each \$1,000 in assessed property value. That means that at the proposed

8.1010 rate, a \$150,000 home with a \$50,000 homestead exemption will see a property tax bill of some \$810.

"If the commission, as a whole, were to increase the tax rate - I wouldn't oppose it because right now I'm paying very little taxes, and I think the community would support it," Klinzman said.

"There are things that need to be done and they need to be done sooner rather than later."

Hendry would support lessened restrictions in business building permitting process to entice more business growth in Clay County, but stressed the importance of controlling the resulting growth.

"I'm not saying just open the floodgates and let everyone just build what they want to, but sit down and reach some common ground and assist the people in whatever their project is," Hendry said.

Hendry placed added importance on controlling business growth projected along First Coast Expressway interchanges. Ultimately, the Expressway will run through Clay County and connect Interstate 95 in northern St. Johns County to Interstate 10 in western Duval County. The limited access toll road is expected to bring

with it an explosion of business growth in the underdeveloped south and west ends of Clay County.

"It could be a big boom for our county or it could be a huge detriment depending on how it's managed," Hendry said.

Hendry also stressed the importance on reducing government regulation. He opposes tax increases and said if there were to be a tax increase it would have to be through methods of direct democracy such as voter referenda.

"I'm not big on taxes," Hendry said. "I'm fiscally conservative and I think anyone who should be taxed should have some input in it. If you don't want extra policemen on the street and fire stations, then that's your choice."

Hendry also said he would support expanding the number of code enforcement officers, but said he hasn't yet looked at how to pay for it.

With less than a week before the Nov. 8 general election, voters will make their decisions soon – if they haven't already in early voting that ends Saturday. Prior to deadline, just under 40,000 Clay voters have already cast their ballots since early voting began for Clay County on Oct. 24.



Political group calls for Florida constitutional amendments on open primaries, redistricting commission in 2018

Tim Canova wasn't kidding when he said he was going to stay involved in the political process following his loss to

Debbie Wasserman Schultz in Florida's 23rd Congressional District.

The progressive Democrat announced the creation of a political and community group last month called "Progress For All," that he said would "will harness

the power of our movement."

He now says the group is "making plans" for a series of referendums on the November 2018 ballot, some of whom other activists have been working for years to try to get on the ballot.

The five referendums Progress For All is calling for are:

- Open primaries in which everyone can vote for any candidate, regardless of party. The top two finishers in the primary, regardless of party, then square off against each other in the general election.
- Creation of a Nonpartisan Redistricting Commission to prevent partisan "gerrymandering" of safe, uncompetitive legislative districts.
- Limiting contributions to Super PACs to \$5,000. This would reign in the corrupting influence of big money in our politics and provide the Supreme Court with an opportunity to overturn Citizens United.
- Election integrity to ensure that our elections are transparent and verifiable. What's needed are paper ballots that are counted by hand in public, as is presently done throughout European democracies.
- Overturning felony disenfranchisement. Unfortunately, the failed war on drugs, mass incarceration and the New Jim Crow have resulted in millions of American citizens being deprived of their right to vote for the rest of their lives, often for nonviolent felonies committed years ago.

Groups were formed in recent years to try to get amendments on open primaries and the automatic restoration of voting rights for ex-felons on this year's ballot, to no avail.

As has been shown in recent years on issues like medical marijuana and solar power, such citizen-led initiatives require millions - in some cases, tens of millions of dollars to get on the ballot.

'Together these reforms would remake our politics in Florida and provide a model for progressive reform throughout our country," Canova said in a statement. "To get these referendums on the ballot in 2018, we must begin now. There's no time to delay. State referendums require the gathering of hundreds of thousands of

Life as an Uber driver

Then the guy got into my car, he seemed shaken. Worn out.


He was in his 30s, I guessed. I was picking him up from the police station in downtown Jacksonville. It was just before 5 a.m., I think, back in July. I was starting my day, driving for Uber, as I did

for a few hours from time to time.

"What's going on. man?" I asked him. "Everything OK?"

"I've been there all night," he said. "I got cariacked at gunpoint a few hours ago.

And off we went.



girlfriend's apartment and decided to make a quick stop at a Winn Dixie off Atlantic Boulevard near Southside Boulevard. When he came back out to his car, someone put a gun to his head. It was two teenagers.

They didn't hurt him, but they made off with his car. After he called 911, officers drove him downtown to file a report. By the time he reached the station, other cops had tracked down his car and arrested the two suspects. Now, I was driving him to his recovered car, on another part of Atlantic, where police were waiting with it.

The thing about Uber, you drive when you want, and you stop driving when you want. You just flip on an app on your phone. When people want a ride, they turn on their Uber app and make a request. It buzzes the closest Uber driver to their location, and the driver hits "Accept."

I've driven at all hours of the day and night, and all over the place, from Ponte Vedra to the Westside, St. Augustine to the Jacksonville Airport. I used to drive semi-regularly, shortly after I moved to the Jacksonville area earlier this year. It's an interesting way to learn a new city.

You end up driving places you otherwise might never learn about, and you meet all sorts of people from all walks life, each with different stories and perspectives on the world.

The Uber app uses the phone's GPS to let the driver know where to go. When I first moved to the area, I probably ended up driving in some places I should have stayed clear of. I didn't know any better. My knowledge of this region was limited.

The next riders I had that morning, after dropping off the guy who had been carjacked, were a husband and wife at the Mayo Clinic. They needed to catch a flight. They had been in town from Sacramento, Calif., for two weeks while he received treatment for cancer. They said they were feeling optimistic.

Another time, I picked up an adult dancer from a club on Beach Boulevard. She was crying and leaning against a fellow dancer. The bouncer helped them into my car. A customer had become physically abusive toward her.

Lots of riders are folks going to or from work, drunk people leaving a bar, or people headed out for a night who don't want to worry about driving.

I've also driven an Australian beauty queen (in town for some sort of pageant), an aspiring rapper/producer headed to Atlanta to perform in a concert and a Marine who was just back from fighting overseas.

I thanked him for his service and for facing down such danger.

"Eh, it's a job," he said.

You never know who's going to buzz in requesting a ride or where you'll end up. That's kind of the best part about it – the people you meet and the conversations you have – plus learning the city.

I don't drive as often as I used to, but sometimes I still flip on the app, just to see what new adventure pops up.

Reader says be wary of the **Amendment 2 lies**

Lies have been told to defeat Amendment 2 to legalize medical marijuana. The truth should be known so the people can cast informed votes.

a "stubbed toe."

Amendment 2 is designed to provide a legal avenue of medical treatment for those like the Jenks who have a debilitating medical condition and can be helped by doctor-prescribed cannabis.

Another lie is being spread by Florida Family Action, that "the Florida Legislature and other state regulatory bodies would be unable to pass common-sense legislation to correct problems with the amendment's outcomes. Instead, another constitutional amendment would be necessary, a very lengthy and costly process."

I know that many might be shocked to think that family values advocates might lie to you, but if they are not lying in this case they are certainly mistaken. The text of Amendment 2 states clearly the Florida Department of Health has up to six months to issue regulations regarding medical marijuana use, and that the Florida Legislature may enact laws consistent with Amendment 2.

It is false to say that medical marijuana will be unregulated, the real fear is that the State will over regulate it.

Whatever your stance, I ask everyone to cast an informed vote on Amendment 2.

signatures on petitions and canvassing of voters to get our message out.

"This is exactly how we were so successful in our recent campaign against Debbie Wasserman Schultz. We created a huge grassroots movement on the ground that knocked on 10,000 doors a week and in the face of enormous odds, got us within striking distance."

When it was announced last month, Progress For All said that they would be limited to small donations and would reject contributions from any corporate-funded political action committees.

Canova, a Nova Southeastern law professor, had never run for political office until he took on Wasserman Schultz in the

Democratic primary earlier this year. His insurgent campaign against the then-Democratic National Committee Chair inspired the same progressive voters around the nation who rallied around Bernie Sanders' presidential candidacy, although Sanders ended up losing by 14 percentage points.

Last week, an award-winning report published a statistical analysis of Canova's race against Wasserman Schultz. At a news conference in Washington, D.C., journalist Lulu Fries'dat raised concerns that the contest's electronic voting machines might have been "manipulated."

Dragway planning to change hours, times of year

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The Green Cove Dragway plans to operate only seasonally next year, focusing on the summer and winter months, if its special-event permit is renewed by the City Council in May.

"We're going to take some time off and analyze certain times of year," said Peter Scalzo, who owns the raceway business. "We haven't determined the exact timeframes yet."

The dragway, located at Reynolds Park, has been operating for three years under a "special event" permit from the city on an annual basis, rather than a more stringent "permanent business" permit. However, the races have been running on most weekends throughout the year.

"We need to look at having this as a permanent-business classification," Green Cove Springs City Council Member Van Royal has said.

Council Member Steven Kelley has suggested a seasonal operation for the dragway, rather than year-round, because it would be more fitting for a "special event."

The raceway has been a source of contention for some people in the area because of the noise it makes during races. Peter Swanson, who lives nearby on the 100 block of Lewis Drive, has been an out-



spoken voice against the track.

"The City has done so much to limit noise, and then they bring in this monstrosity," Swanson said.

Swanson had his property reassessed in August. In September, the Clay County Property Appraiser's Office informed him his property value had dropped by nearly 20 percent – from \$316,319 to \$256,721 – because of the noise nuisance created by the dragway.

"With the noise from the drag strip, in our opinion it does have an impact on how buyers and sellers would behave within that market," said Tracy Drake, assistant Property Appraiser.

The reduction in Swanson's home value also meant roughly \$1,100 off his property

tax bill each year the dragway remains operational, which will reduce tax revenue for the City of Green Cove Springs and Clay County.

However, accounting for approximately 95 residential parcels that could drop in value if reassessed, Drake stated in an email to "Clay Today" on Wednesday the loss in revenue to the City of Green Cove Springs would be \$6,000 per year or less.

Still, considering the Swanson property lost approximately \$59,000 upon reassessment, home resale values would be dramatically lowered across much of the neighborhood.

"We'd rather pay the tax and not have the noise," Swanson said. "This isn't about saving money, it's about quality of life." At a special session in September, in response to an undisclosed number of noise complaints from residents, a line of the dragway's supporters spoke in favor of the track to city council, arguing that it brings in revenue and provides wholesome family entertainment on weekends.

Races typically ran Friday nights, Saturday afternoons and evenings and Sundays. No alcohol has been permitted at the races.

Scalzo announced at the special session that he would be stopping Friday night racing for the rest of this year. The last race this year is scheduled for Dec. 18, with operations resuming on Jan. 7.

The council voted 5-0 to allow the track to remain open.

"The racetrack is the best thing ever to happen to Green Cove Springs," Scalzo told Clay Today in a phone interview. "There's not a lot of other things to do there. There isn't even a movie theater. So many kids don't care about ball sports. They're motor-heads, and the track is a great thing for kids to come out and watch the events. It's a good thing for the community."

For the dragway to continue operating under a "permanent business" permit in May would be unfeasible, so Scalzo is hoping to renew the special-event permit



by changing to a seasonal format.

"I wouldn't be able to afford it if we were required to be a permanent business," said Scalzo, who owns three other drag strips. "I've got insurance, which is very expensive, track prep, the cost to bring in a licensed food vendor, lights."

A typical race-day brings in 40-60 racers, who pay a \$25 entry fee, and around 300 spectators. Tickets cost \$12, except for kids 10 and under, and the city receives

10 percent of the ticket sales.

"The city council has been extremely supportive, and we have been committed to complying with all ordinances and noise codes," Scalzo said. "I started off adding six storage containers to reduce noise. Now I've added 12 more, so it's like an amphitheater setup. You can hear the difference."

The raceway must be in noise compliance for its special-event permit to be renewed. Noise levels may not exceed a 55-decibel limit.

Teacher honored for her work with behaviorally disabled students

LAKE ASBURY – Starting out in her career, Amy Batchelor learned quickly how to calm her students by sharing stories of her own personal struggles. Now, eight years later, her work making such connections with students with behavior disorders has garnered her a prestigious statewide award.

"We share so that these kids know they're not the only ones who are dealing with things," Batchelor said. 'We've come a long way, we've made it. It's been some

struggles but we've done this.' They know that if I can give out some information that they may be dealing with, then they know that they're not alone."

Batchelor, who teaches at Lake Asbury Junior High, was recently named the 2016 winner of the Eleanor Guetzloe Award for Excellence in Teaching Student with Emotional and Behavioral Disabilities., which was presented by the Council for Exceptional Children. The Council is part of an international community of professionals who educate and advocate for not only teachers but also the students they teach.

The council's mission mirrors what Batchelor has been doing all along with her seventh and eighth graders, some of whom live with behavioral disorders, an-

Wells Road nightclub suit ends in \$335,000 settlement

ORANGE PARK – The former owner of an Orange Park nightclub who filed a lawsuit against the Clay County Board of Commissioners regarding ordinances that shuttered his business has reached a \$335,000 settlement with the county.

Christopher White, former owner of Club Christopher's nightclub, and his attorneys have spent the last three years attempting to prove that a combination of county ordinances that effectively prohibited the operation of his club formerly located at 1620 Wells Rd. The suit also claimed that other nightclubs along a 1.9mile stretch of Wells Road referred as the "Wells Road Corridor" directly targeted similar establishments and violated the Private Property Rights Protection Act under inverse condemnation. Inverse Condemnation occurs when the government takes private property but fails to pay the compensation required by the 5th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution.

White's lawsuit asked for a total of \$996,000 under Florida statutes that provide damages to a property owner when a government regulation has "inordinately burdened" the use of a property. Weeks after a July 6 formal mediation session with attorneys for both the county and White, a settlement agreement was reached. The BCC voted in a closed session on Aug. 23 to pay White \$335,000 if he dropped the lawsuit.

The ordinances immediately impacted Club Cristopher's, Club Chameleon and Crazy Horse Saloon when they took effect in February of 2012. White's property went into foreclosure in November 2013.

"The enforcement of this ordinance has not only cost me my profit for the last two years — which is estimated to be approximately \$200,000 — it has also ruined my [Small Business Administration loan] and personal credit," White wrote in a 2015 response to the courts. "[...] As a result, I was unable to pay my creditors and had to result to borrowing money from friends and family in order to take care of my family."

Club Christopher's became a favorite hangout spot for young people from Clay and Duval counties shortly after it opened. Before long, however, it became clear a crime element was rising from the clubs.

"Illicit activity in the area of the Wells Road Corridor has been increasing over the past several years, requiring the deployment of a great disproportionate amount of the [Sheriff's] Office's manpower and resources to combat at tremendous public expense." said court documents.

Between 2005 and 2010 there were several shootings along the Wells Road Corridor. The Clay County Sherriff's Office reported a number of crimes such as DUI arrests, traffic citations, robberies and assaults between the hours of 10 p.m. and 2 a.m.



In 2011, a 32-year-old man was shot twice outside of Club Christopher's after a scuffle in the parking lot. The man survived and officials charged the suspects with attempted murder and possession of a controlled substance.

The rising crime along the corridor formed the county to enact the ordinances following citizen complaints.

In May, Clay County attorneys filed a motion for summary judgment, asking the court make a ruling without a full trial.

Such a judgment may be issued on the merits of an entire case or on discrete issues in that case

A similar incident occurred when White decided to file a suit against the county in federal court in May 2011 alleging the ordinances violated the 14th amendment of the U.S. Constitution involving procedural due process, substantive due process and equal protection.

White's suit was ultimately unsuccessful

In that case, a U.S. District Court granted the county's motion for summary judgment and determined that the ordinances not only did not violate any laws, but commissioners had "clearly described a "conceivably rational basis" between the ordinances and a legitimate government interest."

The federal court further determined that "In reaching its decision to adopt the Ordinances, the Board considered substantial evidence," according to court documents, and therefore did its due diligence in substantiating the claims of drug, gang and violence problems at Club Cristopher's.



ger problems and struggle with troubled home lives

She said her students face with some of the same problems she did growing up.

"When I was 16 [my mother] left me and moved to a different state," Batchelor said. "I woke up and thought people had robbed our house."

Batchelor was stuck with her disenchanted stepfather and left to care for five siblings. She turned to alcohol and drugs for catharsis. It wasn't until she met her husband that she left her old life behind. She's now been married for 27 years and has two children.

Teaching the students is difficult. On two separate occasions, students have physically harmed her. Batchelor said these are largely isolated incidents because she and her three behavioral health assistants can effectively deescalate most situations.

"I love working with these students," Batchelor said. "I feel like these students need someone that can connect with them that understands where they're coming from and I just feel like if I don't do it, who would?"

Batchelor teaches students to be proactive instead of reactive about their behavior by teaching them how to control their breathing. She also teaches them how to be aware of the issues that trigger their sometimes unruly behaviors.

Having witnessed her techniques work, Batchelor developed a program she named "I Control," which, within the next two years, she hopes to take to a national level. The program is currently in a pilot phase in which officials are collecting data about its effectiveness. She's worked on the project for the last two years and has seen how it helps students.

"I Control teaches students how to use the tools within themselves to learn how to keep their behaviors in check, learning to use positive talk and learning that if people are coming at you verbally or physically that you have other opportunities and means [to respond]," she said.

Stephen Smith, a special education professor at the University of Florida nom-

inated Batchelor for the award after working with her on the federally-funded study for the I Control curriculum.

"Ms. Batchelor is a standout, someone I talk about in my teacher preparation
courses here at the University, a true example of what is right about teachers, and
a person who is dedicated in practice and,
most importantly, in spirit, to her students
and their caregivers," Smith wrote in his
nomination letter to the Council. I knew
Dr. Guetzloe for years through national
and state special education professional
organizations and I am most certain that
she would approve...of Ms. Batchelor's
nomination."

Batchelor's students are with her all day. They have lunch together in a round table setting she said promotes a feeling of family among the students. It's something many of the students don't get enough of at home, she said.

"We call ourselves the A-Team," said Jacqueline Dalton, a behavioral health assistant who has worked with Batchelor for five years. "Academics is a huge portion of what we do, but honestly, we are trying to help these students become socially acceptable, what society deems socially acceptable."

Students who prove through their behavior they can re-enter normal classes can do so, but Dalton said she has had students who choose to stay in Batchelor's class in part because it's a comfortable, safe place for them.

"It's a phenomenal program," Dalton said. "We have a high success rate. The majority of our students are completely mainstreamed out of our classroom by the time they hit high school. We have an amazing teacher."

City to survey residents on solar energy

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – City of Green Cove Springs plans to survey a random sample of its utility customers in November and December to gauge their opinions on solar energy.

The purpose of the survey is to determine if enough customers support the idea of solar energy for the city, even if it would require customers to pay a little more for electricity due to the higher cost of solar generation, compared to other forms of generating electricity. The telephone survey will be conducted by GreatBlue Research, a professional market research firm based in Cromwell, Conn. GreatBlue has expertise in this type of survey and was selected in a competitive bidding process. The survey will provide statistically valid information about customer opinion to guide Green Cove Springs Utility's decisions related to solar energy.

GreatBlue will call a random sample of Green Cove Spring's residential customers. If customers have caller ID, the display will show the call is from GreatBlue. The reset is designed to ensure the efficient use of water for landscape irrigation.

Beginning Nov. 6 through the first Sunday in March, landscape irrigation is allowed on one designated day each week before 10 a.m. or after 4 p.m., Saturday for residential landscape irrigation at addresses that end in odd numbers or have no address, Sunday for residential landscape irrigation at addresses that end in even numbers; and Tuesday for nonresidential landscape irrigation.





Thanks to conservation efforts, the manatee population has grown in Florida. In February 2016, FWC announced 6,250 manatees were counted in an aerial survey of Florida waters. For information about manatee protection zones by county, including the seasonal changes, go to My-FWC.com/Manatee and click on "Data and Maps." At the bottom of that same page, there also is information on FWC Manatee COLD-weather changes to speed zones. FWC law enforcement officers will be on the water enforcing these seasonal rules to protect manatees in busy boating areas.

molecular and cell biology, neuroscience and emerging infectious diseases.



Medical students are commissioned as junior officers in their chosen service – Army, Navy, Air Force or U.S. Public Health Service. They are on active duty throughout their education and are compensated as such. Upon completion of their education – including residency – they owe seven years of military service. More than 60 percent of USU graduates serve 20 years or longer.

Photographer takes art underwater

FLEMING ISLAND – With just her camera, Jennifer Tallerico is able to merge

It's that uniqueness that has landed Palatka-based boudoir photographer Jennifer Tallerico a chance to display her work at the Thrasher-Horne Center for the Performing Arts' gallery.

Tallerico's surreal photographs transplant land objects such as flowers, violins and entire pianos into a weightless, underwater atmosphere.

Come, make believe

Fiasco Theatre brings abridged 'Into the Woods' to Clay

ORANGE PARK — A little over a year after critics gave the proverbial thumbs up to Fiasco Theater's off-Broadway rendition of every-fairy-tale-and-the-kitchen-sink musical "Into the Woods," the theatre is taking its show on tour.

The New York-based theater group has decided to kick off this tour with a preview showing at the Thrasher-Horne Center for the Arts near Orange Park.

"Into the Woods" weaves together characters created in several Brothers Grimm

and Charles Perrault fairy tales and is based on the musical of the same name created by James Lapine and Stephen Sondheim. But fans of the eclectic patchwork tale could find something new in Fiasco's rendition.

Each member of the 10-actor cast takes on multiple roles. In addition, each actor plays multiple instruments, controls set changes and is on stage for nearly the entire length of the play. This undoubtedly makes for an interesting and rather difficult rehearsal, but the hard work creates on-stage intimacy between actor, stage and audience.

"We have two more weeks of rehearsal

but I think the most challenging aspect really has been being a part of the show for the entire length of the show," said actor Laurie Veldheer, who plays Cinderella, among others, in the musical. "In case we need to quickly go offstage to get a prop, we are on stage all the time and if we are not on stage we are upstage making music with instruments, grabbing props or changing the set piece. So we're always doing something and we're always engaged in the story itself even if it's just listening."

Veldheer – a native of Grand Rapids, Mich. – said in her 14 year as an actress, this show has especially challenged her, due to the many hats each performer dons during the performance. She also plays toy piano and percussion in the show.

When Fiasco played its first show in January 2015, it did so with a completely different cast, so the new cast is currently rehearsing the material.

Fiasco's rendition is very much a stripped down version of the hit musical. This is, however, by co-directors Noah Brody and Ben Steinfeld's design. It seems

to work. "Into the Woods" garnered Fiasco the 2015 Lucille Lortel Award for Best Revival

"It's really about creating an ensemble experience so what [Brody and Steinfeld] saw with this production is that several people could play several roles and therefore kind of challenge them artistically,"

Veldheer said.

By removing superfluous bells and whistles, Veldheer said the true strengths of the play become visible, because "Into the Woods" is a musical much more interested in what motivates the characters.

The story follows The Baker and his wife, who wish to have a child, Cinderella who wishes to go the King's Festival and Jack, who wishes his cow would produce milk. When the Baker and his wife are visited by the neighborhood witch, who reveals to them that she placed a curse on their family, the two set off on a journey into the woods to reverse the curse.

Their desires lead the characters in one way or another into the woods, where they soon discover they must be careful what they wish for.

Traditionally, the set sits lavishly decorated to immerse the audience in a fairy tale world. In keeping with its intimate setting, the Fiasco rendition uses a large piano as its centerpiece along with backlit ropes to simulate the woods.

"We're saying that we do make believe and we want the audience to come be a part of the make believe as well," Veldheer said.

Although there are very few departures taken from the subject material, a few stylistic choices separate the Fiasco rendition from any other performance. Most noteworthy, Veldheer said, is that a live actor plays Jack's cow, Milky White. Veldheer said this gives the cow its own voice, whether it's for humor or even drama purposes.

"I don't want to give too much away," Veldheer said. "But [Brody and Steinfeld] have created this show that's just so clever and really different from what you'd expect – and we're asking the audience to be a part of that."

"Into the Woods" runs Nov. 26 at 8 p.m. To buy tickets, go online at the enter.org.

mid-1980s and has since evolved to use subjects rather than models in most cases. Boudoir works for men as well.

"The majority say what they loved the best is the weightlessness underwater," Tallerico said. "The only thing they worry about is if they can breathe, they forget about everything besides relaxing and the silence underwater," Tallerico said.

Tallerico has three years of underwater photography experience she uses to supplement her income in the summer months

when boudoir photography – the focus of her photography studio – slows to a crawl.

However, now her underwater boudoir photography has taken off.

"I'm never not busy, basically," she said

Although her art and work intersect often, there are times when inspiration strikes Tallerico and she must find time – and models – to create her artwork.

Boudoir photography is in high demand. Underwater boudoir, a specialized offshoot of the style, is even more so. Increasingly, boudoir photography is seen as something a person might do purely for their own enjoyment, for the pleasure and affirmation of seeing themselves as attractive, daring and sensual.

"They can't believe it's them half the time," Tallerico said. "When they first come in, their shoulders are shrugged and they're not very confident and once they leave here they're so confident. When they see their images, it's really incredible to see their faces."

Tallerico said the feeling accompanies both studio boudoir and underwater boudoir.

She has customers who migrate all the way to California for her services. Basic packages start at around \$300 and can soar to beyond \$2,000.

It's a tedious process, she said. Some people have trouble maintaining their buoyancy, so she uses belts to tie them down. Other times, challenges arise in post-production. Red light disappears underwater, so Tallerico must add it back to give her images a natural vibrancy.

She uses a 25-meter long pool to produce her images with the help of backdrops and careful lighting choices. All this is done under the care of a swim coach and a professional makeup artist.

Tallerico moved to Florida from New York City in 1998 and earned a bachelor's degree in anthropology and a master's degree in engineering from the University of Florida. She said she doesn't miss the rats in New York City, but could do without the flying cockroaches of Florida.

She worked as a scientist for the St. Johns River Water Management District for 12 years examining environmental.

Although the two are seemingly unre-

lated career choices, she said one naturally led into the other.

"I got so much into the science part of it that I understood so much of the issues going on with being underwater that I knew exactly how to combat those by shooting underwater," Tallerico said.

Tallerico started JT Noir Studios in 2007 after she found being a scientist wasn't stimulating enough for her.

When she finally started out as a photographer, she found herself in the purgatory where most amateur photographers find themselves — photographing children and families.

"I really wasn't ever loving it that much because I knew boudoir was where I wanted to go and when I finally opened it [JT Noir Studios] — it just took off," Tallerico said.

Now, JT Noir Studios staffs a professional hair stylist and provides accessories, props and clothing to wear from its St. Johns Avenue offices in Palatka.

Tallerico said she facilitates the entire process.

"You just have to know how to swim," she said

Now, nearly a decade into her career, she teaches photography in classrooms all over the country. However, the Thrasher-Horne Center is the first gallery to show her work.

Tallerico's exhibit, Submerged, runs from October 7 - December 14. The gallery has free admission and is open Monday through Friday 10 a.m. - 3 p.m.

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Stuffed ballot boxes. Forged signatures. Hacked voting machines. Selling votes.

"Rigged election" talk has been on the rise as Election Day approaches. Flori-

da is sure to play a key role in the outcome for president, plus there are a number of hotley-contested down-ballot races.

Florida Citizens for Honest Elections is offering a \$5,000 reward for information leading to the ar-

rest and conviction of anyone engaging in voter fraud. They've set up a 24-hour-hotline

Chris Chambless, supervisor of elections for Clay County, has heard just about enough talk about fraud.

"I think it's an unnecessary distraction," said Chambless, who is also president of the Florida State Association of Supervisors of Elections. "It could potentially cause some people not to be engaged in the voting process."

Chambless added that all signatures are checked during the voter check-in process and during vote tabulation.

"Every vote-by-mail ballot is compared to the signature from voter registration by key staff," he said. "There's a very specific process to provide evidence where a signature differs or there's lack of a signature. And I would argue that the Florida election code is one of the strongest in the nation."

Florida Citizens for Honest Elections is an limited liability corporation started six months ago by a group of Florida

businessmen from around the state who knew each other. Five are Democrats, five are Republicans and two are independents, and they'd like to remain anonymous, according the group's spokesman, Cordell Smith.

"These guys are not a vigilante group, they're not out to prove a point, they're not out for Hillary Clinton or Donald Trump," said Smith, a registered Independent. "They just want to know the election is fair, because this election is vitally important to our country's growth."

One issue that many states are taking seriously is preventing hacking of electronic voting machines. A study in September by the cybersecurity firm Carbon Black found that 56 percent of voters are concerned this year's election will be affected by cyberattacks.

Carbon Black also estimated that as many as 15 million Americans may not vote because they expect their votes will be altered.

No evidence exists of cyberattacks in previous U.S. elections, and Chambless pointed out that Florida is a paper-ballot state. He wrote an open letter to voters earlier this year.

"Florida law mandates that all voting be by marksense ballot, with the temporary exception of voters with disabilities, who may use DRE (touch screen) until 2020," he wrote. "Should any disruption or corruption in the transmission of vote totals occur, we can always refer to the original paper ballot."

Florida's electronic voting systems function on a closed network that is not internet-based and not connected to each other online.


Results from each precinct are transmitted to the supervisor of elections office in what Chambless described as a "brief encrypted burst." Even in the remote chance would-be hackers overcome numerous layers of encryption, the unofficial results being transmitted would be corrupted and slowed but not compromised. Final accumulations transmitted to the state's Division of Elections are uploaded on a separate memory device on a separate system.

This year, 14 states have new voter restrictions in place, promoted by advocates to curb voter fraud. In 2012, Florida was among six states to implement new restrictions. However, this past summer, courts in North Carolina, Texas, Kansas, Wisconsin and North Dakota either struck down or softened the new restrictions, finding little to no evidence of fraud.

"I think the public should be comfortable with the process, given the fact that 100 percent of the voting systems are




Students donate supplies to Waste Not Want Not

tested during a public test, and that after the election, there is a random audit conducted with randomly selected precincts and contests," Chambless said.

Smith said Florida Citizens for Honest Elections has received thousands of calls and emails about possible fraud, but few have been worthwhile.

"We've had a lot of stupid phone calls, if I can say that, coming in," Smith said. "Only two or three have had any real indication of possible fraud, and that makes you proud. Maybe it tells you we have a fair and honest election after all."

school for The Florida Historical Quarterly.

Within its first four months, attendance grew from 26 to 78 students with a faculty of 10 teachers, some of which were black. By 1894, the school had won more than 30 prizes and honorable mentions from the Southern Florida Fair in Orlando and lauded for its curriculum.

The school's success led the AMA to tout that "this young school is doing a work of unestimatable value. On this very sport, where less than a generation ago gangs of slaves toiled under the overseer's lash and within rifle-shot of the plantation's whipping post, their children are now developing into worthy" citizens.

The school sought to train black teachers as one of its core missions as well. This was perhaps the main reason for a mounting opposition against the school's existence.

Then Florida Superintendent of Public Instruction William N. Sheats led the assault on the school after his election in 1893. He had experience as superintendent in Alachua and ran his campaign with the tagline "the biggest little giant in education."

Sheats had been a delegate to the Florida Constitutional Convention of 1885 and authored section 12, which declared blacks and whites must learn in different schools.

Sheats wrote in his first report after his election that "any effort to enforce mixed education of the races ... would forever destroy the public school system at one swoop."

Sheats had already clashed with the principal of State Normal College for Colored Students in Tallahassee for "focusing too much on academics." It wasn't long before The Normal School would see the creation of special laws specifically targeting its operation.

Sheats lobbied on two different occasions for the legislature to shutter the school, and in May 1985, legislators granted his request. New laws were created making it illegal for whites to teach blacks, blacks to teach whites and prohibited any entity from operating a school of any kind where whites and blacks are "instructed or boarded within the same building, or taught in the same class, or at the same time by the same teachers."

In response to criticism, Sheats called the school a "social and moral blotch," a "vile encroachment on our social and moral system" and called its operators "fanatical equalists."

The AMA fought back against Sheats' law and encouraged its teachers to work regardless of the consequences. And they did

It took Sheats until April 6, 1896 until he could indict anyone on charges. Deputies arrested the principal, five teachers, three white patrons and a local congregational minister. AMA immediately paid their bail.

The school continued to operate, but Sheats' continued to threaten jail time for teachers but the AMA could not keep posting bail. The fervor he created scared away many white parents and, with the opening of a nearby white school in Orange Park, there was less reason for whites to attend the school.

In 1911, the school's chapel burned down in what the AMA called "a vicious but unsuccessful attempt to destroy the whole plant" but school buildings remained.

The next year, legislators passed a law prohibiting whites to teach in black schools. The school officially closed a year later due to mounting legislative pressure.

The town aims to unveil the monument on President's Day of 2017. There are no initial indications on what the monument might look like.

Orange Park man arrested on 34 separate child pornography charges

ORANGE PARK - An Orange Park man faces with six counts of transmitting child

pornography and 28 counts of child pornography possession after an investigation into child pornography internet uploads.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Scott Edward Stuart, 40, on Nov. 1 for his alleged involvement in an

internet child pornography uploads which began in Freehold, New Jersey and ended in Clay County. A detective with the federal Internet Crimes against Children Task Force investigated a tip from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. The investigation led to an address in Orange Park.

Investigators sent a subpoena to AT&T U-Verse for subscriber and billing information for the Internet Protocol Address listed in the initial tip. The response gave a house on the 2000 block of Burris Road in Orange Park.

In late September 2015, a month after the first subpoena, investigators subpoenaed the International Flavors and Fragrances Company asking for any employees residing at that address. Stuart's name came with the response, so investigators obtained a warrant to search the contents of a particular email address for May 21, 2015.

On Oct. 27, a county judge issued a search warrant for Stuart's house. During the investigation, investigators found six image files and 22 video files of child pornography. Five of the images and all of the videos allegedly in Stuart's possession on Oct. 27 ranged from a third degree felony charge to a second-degree felony, according to the report.

Detectives forwarded the investigation results to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement's Jacksonville Regional Operations Center to finish the investigation.

Stuart remained in the Clay County Jail at press time with bond set at \$310,102 bond.

Man charged with criminal mischief and assault for hospital hubbub

ORANGE PARK - A Jacksonville man is charged with assault on a medical care

provider and a security guard along with criminal mischief for a ruckus he allegedly created in Orange Park Medical Center.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested John James Fennell, 24, on Oct. 26 after he alleg-

edly charged at hospital personnel with a

closed fist, scaring them, and threw a table at a wall in one of the hospital's Emergency Room, the report said.

Fennell had allegedly been Baker Acted initially, but it was rescinded and the suspect was being discharged from the hospital before the incident occurred. He became enraged that he could not find his ID while hospital staff informed him that they had no record of Fennell's ID, the report

Fennell allegedly picked up a tray table, threw it at the wall next to him, and took a step towards hospital personnel with his fists balled. Deputies intercepted him and restrained him without further incident.

There was a four inch by two-inch gash in the wall where the tray table impacted.


Deputies arrested Fennel and transported him to the Clay County Jail, where he remained on a \$10,004 bond.

At press time, Testani remained in the Clay County Jail with bond set at \$55,010.

Man free on bond after assaulting cop and nurse

ORANGE PARK – What began as a police call for a domestic disturbance ended

in an arrest on charges of beating a sheriff's deputy and a nurse.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Robert Logan Long, 26, of Orange Park, on Oct. 30 at 1:27 a.m. at his home in the 1700 block of Wells Road.

According to the

police report, when officers arrived to take care of the domestic dispute, Long first approached officers "with his fist clinched, and in a threatening manner," the report states. Officers called for an emergency medical team to come to the home as Long

had "pre-existing injuries from the fight he was involved in." They tried to restrain Long, but he kept resisting. An officer finally restrained Long using an electronic taser.

When police interviewed the victim – Long's live-in girlfriend of two years – she said the fight began when Long started drinking and became intoxicated.

"[She] stated the defendant started swinging at her, and struck her in the back of the head with a closed fist," the report states.

The victim also said Long kicked her in the shins. She said the fight escalated to a point where she asked two men to restrain Long, but that escalated into a fight with the two men.

Long was later transported to Orange Park Medical Center for medical treatment prior to being transported to the Clay County Jail. While at the hospital, police said, Long "intentionally spit blood on her against her will" and struck her in the chest and arm.

Long faces one count each of battery on an emergency medical care provider,

assaulting a law enforcement officer and simple domestic battery.

\$100K bond set for alleged stabber

MIDDLEBURG – Authorities have charged a Middleburg woman with entering a man's home and stabbing him in the chest and back.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Christina Lynn Hathaway, 31, of Fargo, Ga. on Oct. 29 at 8:51 p.m. after conducting an investigation.

According to the police report, Hathaway entered a home in the 100

block of Cinnamon Street to collect some of her belongings that had been in the home. However, when the home's owner arrived, he "began telling her to leave and she is not allowed to be in his residence," the report states. The victim said the incident began when he arrived home and found a friend of Hathaway's standing in his driveway who said "the suspect Christina Hathaway was in his residence retrieving some of her belongings." Police do not specify the relationship between Hathaway and the victim.

The victim told police that when he took out his cell phone to call the CCSO, Hathaway "grabbed a screwdriver from the living room floor with her right hand and in an upward motion stabbed him in his lower right bicep." After being stabbed, he dropped his cell phone and starting walking outside to a neighbor's house so he could call police. He said, that's when Hathaway stabbed him in the back with the screwdriver.

Police said the victim continued to tell Hathaway that she needed to leave and that's when she picked up his cell phone and threw it across the yard into some overgrown bushes.

At press time, Hathaway remained in the Clay County Jail where she is booked

Land dispute results in assault charge

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – A Keystone Heights woman is under house arrest after being arrested and charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, a second-degree felony.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Lisa Jo Clary, 58, on Oct. 29 at 5 p.m. after conducting a brief investigation.

According to the police report, Clary entered the property of one of her next-door neigh-

bor's wielding a gun, which she shot into the air around 5:38 p.m. that day.

The victim told police that she and her husband and son-in-law were clearing a section of property that her family owns in the 4900 block of County Road 214.

"The neighbor, defendant Lisa Clary, disputes ownership of the property and there has been an ongoing conflict about the boundaries," states the police report.

The victim told police that she told Clary to leave her property and then called 911 to contact the CCSO.

"The victim stated that she was in fear for her life and believed that the defendant would shoot..." states the report.

Since her arrest, Clary has posted a \$10,003 bond, been placed into a GPS monitoring program and has been issued a no contact order with the victim and her family. According to court documents, Clary cannot go within 2,500 feet of the victims' homes, places of employment or vehicles. Clary has also been prohibited from having any firearms in her home while the case moves its way through the courts.

Illegal dumping charge for tree service

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – Environmental Crimes Investigators have charged a Keystone Heights man with illegally dumping what's considered hazardous waste in an attempt to avoid paying landfill dumping fees.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office took out a warrant for William James Costello, 33, on Oct. 26 and charged Costello the next day after he turned himself in at CCSO headquarters in Green Cove Springs.

Investigator Robert E. Dews said Costello and his company, Costello's Tree Service, dumped a commercial trailer load of freshly-cut and dumped tree debris in the county right of way without a permit.

"The defendant received economic gain by dumping the waste illegally versus paying to have it properly disposed of," states the arrest warrant.

According to the warrant, a CCSO deputy saw Costello's truck exit a wooded area

at the intersection of County Roads 214 and 315-C.

"When the deputy checked the area, he discovered a large (16' a 10' a 4'; 640 cubic feet) pile of freshly cut and dumped tree debris in the area where he just witnessed



the defendant's truck and trailer," according to the warrant.

Since being booked on the charge - a third-degree felony - Costello has posted a \$2,503 bond.

Child abuse charge for Orange Park woman

ORANGE PARK

– A week after being charged with one count of child abuse, an Orange Park woman remains in the Clay County Jail without bond.

Police arrested Pamela Marie Weister, 46, on

Oct. 26 at 2:13 a.m. after responding to her home where the alleged incident occurred.

According to the police report, Weister struck one of her male children multiple times during a fist fight while she was apparently intoxicated. Police said the fight

began after "a verbal argument about cleaning." Police said during the fight, Weister allegedly took a pair of scissors and cut into bags of deer corn that was housed in the garage of the home. She also allegedly damaged a nearby deer feeder.

The victim told police that he went to another part of the house "due to a history of violence between him and the defendant, in an effort to prevent further confrontation," states the report.

Within minutes, the victim said they heard loud banging noises coming from the garage with Weister continuing to yell at him. When the child threatened to call the Clay County Sheriff's Office, Weister demanded he give her his cell phone, but he refused. The victim said that's when Weister grabbed the child by the neck with both hands and pushed him against a dresser. The child and Weister got into a fist fight with Weister clawing the child with her fingernails.

The fight escalated to a point that the child fled to a neighbor's home in the 2500 block of Doctors Lake Drive where they called police.

According to court documents, Weister now faces three counts of violating probation from charges dating back to 2012 and 2013 in the aftermath of the new charges.

Court documents show Weister was charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon and domestic battery in April 2012 and one count of firing a gun in September 2012. In July 2013, she was charged with two counts of battery on a law enforcement officer and one count of simple battery.

payment that she received monthly. As part of the theft, Adams used his mother's name on checks that he would write to transfer money between her accounts. He would then use the funds on himself. The total amount Adams stole was \$35,345.

As part of the plea agreement, Adams agreed to forfeit any right to appeal the sentencing, as well as agreed to make full restitution of the stolen Social Security funds.

Adams was indicted April 14 by a federal grand jury on one count of bank fraud, one count of theft of government property and four counts of aggravated identity theft. However, under terms of the plea agreement, federal officials dropped four

counts of the April indictment.

According to the indictment, Adams's mother, Janell Y. Adams, 80, died in an unknown manner at some time prior to July 4, 2014. Detectives with the Clay County Sheriff's Office retrieved her body from the backyard of her home where Brian Lee Adams had also lived with her previously.

Adams buried her in the yard to conceal the event, cause and circumstances of her death. Adams then stole his deceased mother's pension funds and Social Security benefits until June 2015, when authorities discovered what he had done with her body

When the body was discovered, Adams was held by authorities in Columbus County, North Carolina and was extradited to Florida as the investigation continued.

During the investigation, authorities discovered that between July 2014 and

about June 2015, Adams took his mother's \$576.76 pension check she received from Anheuser Busch that was deposited monthly into an account at the Citizens National Bank of Quitman. Authorities said Adams would then write checks off of his mother's account as well as use a bank card associated with the account.

On June 17, 2015, Clay County Sheriff Rick Beseler characterized Brian Adams as the man "responsible for the burial" but did not have enough information regarding cause of death.

Adams has a record of multiple arrests in Clay County dating back to June and December 2009 when he was charged with speeding. He was charged with marijuana possession in November 2011. He also has a criminal record in Baker County.

A January 2014 traffic stop in Macclenny, Fla. resulted in charges of posses-

sion of methamphetamine and controlled substances without a prescription. According to Baker County court records, Adams pleaded guilty to attempted unlawful possession of a listed chemical and was sentenced to 18 months' probation and ordered to report to the probation office in Starke, Fla.

If convicted on the new federal charges, Adams faces up to 30 years in federal prison for the bank fraud count, up to 10 years for the theft of government property count, to be followed by two years' imprisonment for the aggravated identity theft counts.

This case was investigated by the Clay County Sheriff's Office, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, the Social Security Administration - Office of Inspector General, and the United States Secret Service.

Invader Alert: Cycad Aulacaspis Scale

UF/IFAS Environmental Horticulture Agent

One of the most common and well recognized insects seen throughout Clay County is the Cycad, also known as the Sago Palm. However, for a few years now this plant has been on the decline, even as

more are planted, by an alien invader that is very difficult to control and is widespread throughout our county.

The pest, known as Cycad Aulacaspis Scale or Asian Cycad Scale, is called what's a small shield

scale. Scale insects are sap-feeding insects named for the scale or shell-like waxy covering that conceals their bodies.

They can weaken and even kill trees, shrubs and houseplants, but in general, complete loss of the plant is rare.

The two I'm referring to only attack Cycads, including the popular King and Queen Sago. This insect is fairly easy to miss as an individual, appearing as a white speck less than 1/16 of an inch long. It can wipe off by hand but the sheer number of insects can overwhelm an otherwise healthy plant.

As the scales lay eggs, they hatch and

become mobile "crawlers" that can then move on to other nearby plants. They tend to start on the trunk or the base of the fronds before moving outward on the fronts and onto the roots.

The insect tends to be most numerous in warm weather. If not properly identified and controlled, the insect will kill the host

When looking for Asian Cycad, monitor for the insect on the fronts and trunk but also look for chlorotic spots. As time goes on, the scales will become more prevalent and easy to see, including dead scales that tend to persist on the plant. Eventually, the infestation can get so bad that the frond will turn almost all white or become brown and die.

The scale will also do major damage to the root system of the host, which will lead to its death.

In terms of control, as recommended by the University of Florida, one of the most simple homeowner practices is to wash down the frond with a strong jet of water periodically to remove live and dead

When monitoring, you can tell live and

dead scales by the fact that dead scales will be dry and powdery while live ones will be moist and gooey when scraped.

After washing, horticultural oils can be applied and the cool of the fall, winter and early spring sun can damage the plant by shining through the oil. This should be done once a week for a month. If scale infestations on a leaf are very high you may choose to remove that frond and place it in a sealed trash bag in the regular, landfill bound garbage.

Another great way to protect your sabal palms is to be vigilant in the materials chosen for your vard. Make sure that any new cycads that are brought onto your property are free of scale. Many insects and diseases can tag along on new plants, mulch, compost and topsoil.

There are two known biological control agents, a predatory beetle and a predatory wasp that were introduced in Florida in the mid-1980's but neither gives complete control.

If vigilance is paid to your plants, the cycad scales can be managed but are likely to return. If you like the form of the sabal palm, another plant to consider would be Coontie. Zamia floridana, which is native to our state and well adapted to the climate of Northeast Florida.



Quick 'bends' for Lancer soccer win

FARMVILLE, Va. – Fleming Island High graduate and soccer star Janese Quick, now playing at Longwood University in Virginia, is no physics major, but on Oct. 29, she gave physics professors at her Longwood University plenty of material for their next lecture.

Quick used the Magnus Effect to her full advantage on the game-winning goal, bending an untouched corner kick into the back of the net to give the Lancers (7-9-1, 4-3-1 Big South) all the cushion they needed to take down Big South foe Charleston Southern 1-0 at the Longwood Athletics Complex on Oct. 22.

Quick's physics exposé came in the 47th minute as part of a dominant allaround effort from the Lancers, who outshot Charleston Southern 26-1 on the way to their fifth conference shutout of the year. The game-winning goal launched off Quick's foot, bent around the baseline and curved just inside the far post to give Longwood a crucial win as the Lancers make their final push to snatch a top-four spot in the Big South standings and home field advantage in the upcoming Big South Championship quarterfinals.

"I knew with the wind, I'd have to play it out a little bit further than usual and just hope for the best," Quick said of the goal, which was her fourth of the season. "I gave it my best shot. Everyone was on the goal line, so I was hoping somebody would get something on it. I guess they didn't need to."

While wind gusts that reached up to 10 miles per hour Saturday may have played a slight role in aiding Quick's goal, the longrange score is nothing new for the junior midfielder. Of her four goals this season, two have come on free kicks outside the box that both times she manipulated over player-walls and past the outstretched hands of goalkeepers more than 20 yards away

"Somebody was yelling at me, saying 'Jayden, touch it!'," said Longwood defender Jayden Metzger, who was lined up in the box on Quick's corner kick. "It looked like it was going in, so I didn't want to touch it."

The goal was the lone offensive highlight from an otherwise dominant day from the Lancers, who unleashed a 90-minute barrage on Charleston Southern goalkeeper Liz Amanda Brown. Longwood crushed double-digit shots in both halves and put nine of those on goal, finally breaking through against one of the Big South's top goalkeepers en route to moving to within one game of securing home field advantage in the Big South Championship's opening round

Brown, who entered the matchup ranked second in the Big South with a 0.99 goals against average, put up an heroic effort in the midst of Longwood's immense

pressure, dispatching eight of the nine shots she faced. Her lone blemish came on Quick's improbable corner kick, but it was enough to disrupt her for her fifth shutout of the season.

"First and foremost, give credit to Charleston Southern for coming in here and playing their third game in four days and making it a tight match," said Longwood head coach Todd Dyer. "They were organized and patient defensively and very tough for us to break down. You can see that in the stats because we had a lot of the ball and tons of chances, but just couldn't find the net as much as we would've liked."

Longwood's attack came from all angles with 12 players sending in shots, including freshman Emilie Kupsov who launched a career-high seven across 63 minutes of action. Quick also put all three of her shots on goal.


On the other end of the field, Longwood $\,$

junior goalkeeper Maria Kirby registered her sixth shutout of the season without recording a save. She benefited from the stonewall defense provided by 90-minute marathon efforts from the defensive quartet of Metzger, Gina D'Orazio, Sydney Wallace and Jessica O'Bryant, who held Charleston Southern without a shot on goal for the duration. Those four helped Longwood keep Big South scoring leader Anna Sells in check, keeping the eight-goal scorer without a shot for the entire match.

The dominant performance took on even more significance for D'Orazio, Metzger and O'Bryant, who along with fellow senior forward Christina Corbin and Amanda Spencer were honored before the game for Senior Day. Those five have just one home game remaining in the regular season, hosting Presbyterian on Oct. 25, but hope to play at least once more at the Longwood Athletics Complex by securing home-field advantage in the Big South quarterfinals.

"Bottom line, we got the win we wanted on the senior day, the win we needed in terms of improving our seed for the tournament, and the win that we ultimately deserved on the day," Dyer said. "With that said, I hope our seniors know just how much we love and appreciate them for all of their hard work over the years, and today is a day they can enjoy and celebrate now."

GAINESVILLE — Fleming Island High junior cross country runner Andrew Miller stated very emphatically in August that his goal was to go to the Class 4A state cross country championships in Tallahassee with teammate Evan Fuller, who ran an equally inspiring season in 2015 with a final 42nd overall finish at the Class 4A championship

Fast forward to the 2016 region 1-4A championship race held Saturday at Gainesville's Santa Fe Community College and Miller snatched his dream with a 14th overall finish. Unfortunately, Fuller finished 16th, a place out of the top 15 that advance to the state meet.

As the pack entered the final 400 meter straightaway to the finish, Miller and Fuller both battled amongst the field with Miller taking 14th in 16:14.30 while Fuller

PANAMA CITY BEACH — Oakleaf High senior Elianna Kennon put her name in the hopper for a Class 3A state title in swimming with a second place finish at the Region 1-3A championships held Oct. 28 in Panama City Beach.

Kennon, a three-time state qualifier in the 50 and 100 freestyle events, makes her final trek to the state championships, held November 5 in Stuart, with her 24.48 second place finish to Nease High's Ria Malhotra's 24.35. The top four finishers in the region 50 free all were under 25 seconds with 29 seconds separating the foursome. Kennon was sixth in 2015 in the 50 free at 24.24. Malhotra was 13th in 2015.

In the state meet heat sheets, Kennon's

finish rendered her a fourth place ranking with the top 50 free split at 24.21, then Malhotra, then a 24.38 from Martin County. In the state list for the 50 free, nine swimmers are under 25 seconds.


with his fastest leg of the season with a 21.03 split to push the Golden Eagle lead to nearly unassailable.

The race was staged by 1st Place Sports of Jacksonville.



Bobcats held Fleming Island to 83 yards on 41 rushes in a game that Hyams sat out due to injury. Friday, Hyams completed eight of 15 passes for 123 yards.

No completion was bigger than a 40 yard bomb to McCaskill on the Golden Eagles' first play from scrimmage. Hyams handed to Jackson Bull on what looked like a sweep right, but Bull handed off to WR Nick Ferendo coming back to the left. Ferendo pitched the ball back to Hyams, who threw to McCaskill down the left sideline. The drive stalled after three penalties, but Fleming Island had served notice that they would not be predictable on this night.

While the defense provided opportunities, the offense used a punishing ground game to take advantage.

Nine different Golden Eagles carried the ball, racking up 323 yards while averaging nearly eight yards per carry. Mackey, who plays running back in the Golden Eagles' short yardage formation, scored the game's first points on a two vard run after Max Michaels recovered a fumble at the Commanders' 16 yard line.

Despite the ease with which Fleming Island moved the ball, they led only 10-7 at halftime due to two missed field goals and penalties that nullified two touchdown runs. The Golden Eagles were penalized 12 times in the first half, and 16 times on the night, for a total of 145 yards.

White's Mondy had a monster game. catching eight passes for 227 yards and two touchdowns. Steward pitched in with 99 yards rushing on 20 carries, scoring the Commanders' first touchdown on a 13 yard run. Class 6A White falls to 3-5.

Just as important as the defense's creation of turnovers was the rediscovery of McCaskill as an offensive weapon. The week before, he had been held to minus one yard rushing on six carries and lost yardage on his only reception.

"McCaskill is a part of the game plan every week," said Springs. "But this week, the offensive line opened some holes for

By design, Springs got all of his seniors involved in their final home game. Senior Joshia Robinson started at running back and contributed 51 yards on seven carries. Reserve receivers Billy Sado and Kevin Freeburger each caught passes.

Augustine the ball at the Bronco 22 yard line. The Yellow Jackets scored off the fumble on an 11 yard touchdown pass to Emerson Kabus to take a 17-7 lead with 10 minutes left before halftime.



Fromt their own 20, Oakleaf used a mix of mid-level passes with a 33 yard catch by Jakari Williams and tailback KeShawn King pounding the interior setting up a 28 yard slant pass to wideout Rontrez Morgan for a score the first salvo of the touchdownheavy event.

Oakleaf looked to keep the Bartram Trail offense at bay with Smith and second quarterback Joey Gatewood constantly hitting the edges of the Knights defense only to find defensive tackle Jayon Bradley in the middle and defensive back Tristan

Brown outside the hashmarks both making key stops.

In the second quarter, with the game still just 7-0, Bartram Trail found tight end Gary Breuklander on a pass from Smith from midfield that finished at the Knights' one yard line where defensive back Nick Roberts shoved Breuklander out of bounds. The Bears though would score from the one to tie the game at 7-7.

A field goal and an interception that led to a 21 yard touchdown run gave the Bears a 17-7 lead with 9:21 left in the half and the game threatening to get out of hand. Strong running by Bartram Trail tailback Devon Ellison put the Bears back in the end zone for a 24-7 lead with just 3:23 to the half.

On the ensuing drive, Morgan hauled in a 15 yard sideline pass, but also got a personal foul flag against Bartram Trail on the out-of-bounds tackle to push the Knights into the Bears red zone where King finished the drive from seven yards out.

Down 24-14, Oakleaf gave up a field goal off another long pass to Breuklander that landed the Bears at the Oakleaf 26 yard line.

In the third period, with Oakleaf punting out of their first series, Bartram Trail capitalized on a short punt to start at the Knights' 35 before scoring on a 12 yard pass to up the lead to 34-14.

Oakleaf had their best shot at a quick response, but a wide open Jamaric Bonner could not get the handle a Johnson pass to force another Todd Nixon punt.

As the fourth quarter loomed and the Oakleaf offense seemingly unable to get a break between dropped passes and inopportunistic penalty flags, Knights safety Kwame Clark snagged a bobbling football off the hands of Gatewood, who set up as a wideout, and returned it to the Bears 14 where wideout Jordan Madison grabbed a Johnson pass in the back of the end zone to turn the game into a 34-21 thriller-to-be.

On the Bears next series, it was defensive back Tristan Brown who stepped in front of a missed slant pass for the second interception of the night. Brown would get the ball to the Oakleaf 35 yard line where King would burst downfield off right tackle to put the score at 34-28 with the Knightmares about to lose their minds in the stands.

Bartram Trail would responde with a 10-play scoring drive featuring a Gatewood scramble for 31 yards and a personal foul flag launching a touchdown run by Gatewood from the eight and a 42-28 Bears lead with 6:35 left in the game.

Oakleaf would benefit from a Bears horse-collar flag on a pass to Morgan to keep the ensuing drive alive before Johnson found Morgan in the corner of the end zone to score the game 42-35 with 3:41 still on the clock.

An onsides kick with Clark in perfect position failed to go 10 yards and Gatewood would take the next snap 50 yards to push the score to 49-35 and deflate the Knights' comeback attempt.

Johnson would engineer a final stab at the lead from the Knights' 20 after the kickoff, but the offense, with an end zone pass to Morgan just out of bounds, stalled at the Bears' 13 yard line to end the game.

Oakleaf ends their season with North Marion, 5A power, visiting on Friday. North Marion (4-3, 2-0) won the district 6-5A title Belleview High School.


On the whole, the Clay County football scene provided some sparks, not many upsets, but lots of thrillers for the year.
