## School sports, bus, other fees could drop

But lunches for younger students rising to \$3

Lunch prices could increase at Macomber School and at Westport Elementary next school year, but sports and some other school fees might drop according to a revised fee structure up for possible vote this week (after Shorelines went to press).

After discussions at two meetings, the School Committee seemed poised to vote on the changes at its late-June session, but that stalled over concerns by several members about the need for committee members to sign conflict of interest forms before taking action.

Fee discussion arose because some families have voiced concern about what they say are high fees for sports, transportation and other things that add up to significant sums, especially for those with more than one child in the system. Some worry that the fee burden can serve to discourage participation in multiple activities.

There is urgency to getting the fee system approved since forms have to be sent to families as soon as possible, said school Business Manager Michelle

The proposed changes, outlined by Ms. Rapoza at the June 1 meeting and then revised a bit at the next meeting

- Raise lunch price for Macomber School and Westport Elementary from \$2.75 per student lunch to \$3. That recommendation came after it was learned that the amount Westport charges is less than a formula set by the state Department of Elementary & Secondary Educa-
- Reduce the student parking fee from
- Student activity fee would stay at \$25 with a \$100 cap for students who are involved in several clubs and activities.
- Transportation (school bus) fee for grade 7-12 students would drop from \$225 to \$200; family transportation cap would drop from \$450 to \$400.
  - Sports equipment (formerly known

spirit was evident as the parade set off at 10 a.m. sharp from the corner of Hix Bridge Road.

Leading the way was long-time town tax assessor Jack McDermott, who retired recently after 42 years on the job . He was chauffeured in a VW convertible by colleague Steve Medeiros and, in what must be out of the ordinary for his line of work, was treated to loud cheers along the way.

Sharing the proud moment (and helping out with the parade) were both of his daughters — Ann Boxler, a member of the parade committee, and Beth McDermott who made the trip up from Washington DC for the occasion and did parade route golf cart duty.

Last year's chief marshal, Eddie 'Fast Eddie' Beaulieu, now 101 years old, didn't ride this year but watched and waved from his son's driveway.

There were, as always, veterans, Scouts and politicians.

State Senator Michael Rodrigues rode in an old car; Rep. Paul Schmid drove a tractor in his farming clothes.

"What a day — perfect weather, low humidity, light breeze ... we could not have asked for better," said parade committee Chairman David Palmer.

The parade flowed smoothly, nobody got hurt, nobody that he knows of got in trouble — "everybody just had fun celebrating Independence Day in Westport."

One change — marshaling antique cars and trucks in Beech Grove Cemetery to help keep Hix Bridge Road open for emergency vehicles, worked like a charm.

"We had a volunteer at the gate and when I needed five cars I'd hold up five fingers and out would come five cars."

Ms. Rapoza said costs might also be offset by the impact of school energy savings via participation in a solar energy program and a (hoped for) repeat of last year's milder than usual winter.

## Colorful peacock surprises passersby

TIVERTON — Some South Tiverton residents have been greeted by the startling sight of a peacock strutting in their midst.

The large blue and green bird, native to India and Sri Lanka, was first spotted in the neighborhood off Sawdy Pond Road (next to the Westport town line) around November of last year and has apparently taken up residence in the area. It is unclear where the peacock came from or to whom it belongs.

West Place Animal Sanctuary on Main Road Tiverton has four peacocks in its collection that were rescued from the animal abuse property in Westport, and it is thought to be the only location in the vicinity that has a documented peacock.

West Place owner Wendy Taylor said that all four of their peacocks are present and accounted for.

"My guess is, especially based on that past Westport case, I think you'd be surprised to see how many undocumented peacocks are in this area," Ms. Taylor said.

Ms. Taylor said that she has received calls about the loose peacock as well as one supposedly roaming about in North Tiverton. That one, she said, used to belong to a farmer in the area but may have escaped.

"I understand that once it got away it became semi-wild and either no one can catch it or the farmer has expressed that there is no desire to try and retrieve the

peacock," Ms. Taylor said.

Ms. Taylor isn't concerned about the south Tiverton peacock being able to find food because there are plenty of berries and bugs to eat. She is, however, worried about it being able to survive during the winter months.

"We had a mild winter this past winter but if we have one like we had a few years ago that could be devastating to a peacock," Ms. Taylor said.

Ms. Taylor said her facility is ill-equipped to try to capture it.

"Unfortunately we don't have any special powers that other people don't have. We really can't do anything. Peacocks can go up to 60 feet in height in a tree and roost up there ... they are flighted birds and they are big birds. Unless they are in a situation from which they couldn't escape, we wouldn't be able to walk up and get that peacock."

Ms. Taylor also said that animal control is aware of the wild peacocks in the town. Efforts to contact Tiverton's animal control officer for comment went unanswered.

## Provender building goes on the market

TIVERTON — The building that houses Provender in Tiverton is for sale, and is listed for \$1.2 million. The three-story building sits at the northwest corner of Puncatest Neck Road and Main Road in Tiverton Four Corners.

The first floor of the building is currently home to Provender, Inc. (doing business under the name of Provender Fine Foods).

It is the building that is for sale," said Kristin Parella, a sales associates at Lila Delman Real Estate International's Newport office, which is marketing the building.

The business is under the separate ownership of Jennifer Borden, who said she didn't know whether the business would continue if the building is sold. "You'll have to talk to my landlord," she said.

Town records show the owners of the building, located at 3883 Main Road in Tiverton, are Scott and Cynthia Burns, and indicate the structure was built in 1850. Its most recent valuation for tax purposes

showed land and improvements valued at a total of \$442,800 (0.25 acres, land valued at \$101,100 and improvements at \$341,700).

"For over 35 years, the business has been a beacon to those who crave gourmet sandwiches and sumptuous baked goods, in one of the most heavenly pockets of Southern Rhode Island — South Tiverton," said Ms. Parella. The building was also home to the Virginia Lynch Gallery, and exhibited works of artists such as Gretchen Dow Simpson, Howard Ben Tre, and Edward Koren, to name a few, she said.

The 4,518 square foot building was restored in 2007 and offers three levels for mixed-use commercial endeavors. The first floor retail has a full kitchen, refrigeration and full basement for storage. The second and third floors offer five light-filled rooms ideal for an art gallery or office. There is also the potential for multifamily, mixed-use, subject to a special use permit, Ms. Parella

## For monarchs' sake, spare the milkweed

nce among the most abundant and lovely of backyard summertime visitors, the monarch butterfly is vanishing at a disturbing rate.

Easy as it is to blame habitat abuse in the species' Mexican winter home, it turns out that harm done here may be even worse.

Not so long ago, the orange and black butterflies were everywhere in New England — gardens were visited by dozens at a time. Last summer, though, weeks went by

without a sighting and it's getting worse fast.

Researchers say there are now one-fifteenth as many monarchs as there were in 1997 and that the population in their Mexican range last winter dropped by 59 percent from the previous year.

Some of the fault does lie with Mexico where loggers have stripped sections of the mountainous fir forests where the butterflies spend their winters. But those forests are now better protected and the cutting is greatly diminished.

Not diminished at all, however, is the assault here on milkweed, the butterflies' primary source of food and the plant on which they lay their eggs.

Considered by many a roadside weed and nuisance, milkweed is attacked with poison spray and weedwackers. Once everywhere along South Coast roadsides, the East Bay Bike Path — lots of places — milkweed has fallen victim to our preference for the well-manicured look. And as milkweed goes, so go monarch butterflies.

The only hope for these creatures is a less heavy-handed approach by all — highway road crews, landscapers and homeowners

Milkweed may be a 'weed' to some. To a monarch butterfly it is life itself.



### Yankee's last day — everything went wrong

To the editor:

As a charter member of the Westport Fishermen's Association, I have always been proud of our accomplishments. The latest is our wreck display. Project coordinator Tanja Ryder did most of it. Tanja is super at building programs.

Seeing the picture of the Navy cruiser "Yankee" sitting on Chickens Reef off Westport made me think someone might like to know how she got there. The "Yankee" was a cargo ship when the Navy bought it and covered it with rapid fire guns and torpedo tubes. It did a great job during the Spanish-American war. It was retired a few times and then used as a torpedo training ship.

The day of the grounding, the Yankee had a torpedo explode in the tube while in Vineyard Sound. No one was hurt but if you look at the picture in this (June 22) newspaper, you will see the black color up forward on the port side. That's the location of the explosion.

The Yankee came through Quick's Hole Channel into Buzzards Bay and set course about northwest for Newport. The fog was very thick and when the captain heard the horn of a ship entering the bay, he called for full astern to stay clear of the approaching ship.

There was no radar or sounding machines, and when the entering ship had cleared the captain ordered the single

screw vessel to go forward and the Yankee drove onto the Chickens Reef. It is possible that the captain did not know about what happens when a large propeller is put in reverse. It will turn counter-clockwise and, as if the bottom of the prop were on solid ground, will cause the stern to go to port. Instead of heading northwest, the course was now north and headed for the ledge.

Forty years ago, as a member of U.S.Power Squadrons, I taught boat handling and this subject was part of it. A salvage attempt for the Yankee is a story in itself at another time.

#### **John McFarland Bergland III**

#### Physician, teacher; avid lacrosse, tennis player

John "Jack" McFarland Bergland III,



MD, 85, passed away Friday, June 2017, from acute myeloid leukemia (AML). He was the loving husband of Gertraude (Bippart) Bergland to whom he was married 41 years.

Born in Baltimore, Md., December 11, 1931, son of the late John McFarland, Bergland, Jr. and Julia (Whitridge) Bergland, he lived in Baltimore and Houston, Tex., before moving to Westport in 2002.

A graduate of Gilman School in Baltimore, he went on to Princeton University ('54), where his grandfather and father had preceded him. He attended Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine ('62) and completed his post-graduate training at University of Kentucky, Lex-

He was one of the founding members of Medical Clinic of Houston and spent much of his career as Senior Partner Internal Medicine Medical Clinic of Houston from 1968 – 2000. Jack taught as an associate clinical professor of medicine at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, St. Luke's Hospital in Houston and at the University of Texas School of Medicine. He won numerous teaching awards and commendations from each of these institutions, which made him extremely proud. Upon retiring to New England, he continued practicing as a physician with Harbor Medical in Scituate, Mass., through 2011. In retirement, Jack volunteered in a community clinic for the medically indigent and frequently travelled abroad to volunteer his skills and knowledge. Helping patients with their medical needs proved extremely gratifying for him.

A skilled athlete in football basketball and tennis, Jack had a special love for lacrosse. His beloved Gilman team won the Maryland State Championships in '48, '49, and '50 and still holds the Maryland State record for fewest goals scored in a season, allowing only 18 goals in 10 games. Jack was recognized as 1st string All Maryland during his junior and senior years and served as co-captain. While playing lacrosse at Princeton, he played as a member of the undefeated freshman team and played on the '53 National Champion Team. These victories, and later being co-captain of the National Open Champion Mount Washington Wolfpack in '59, were lacrosse highlights in his life. He helped to found lacrosse in Texas in '73 and as a waring-sullivan.com

result served on the National Lacrosse Foundation Board for three years.

Throughout Jack's adult life, he was also an avid tennis player. While fiercely determined to compete and win on the court, he always brought humor and life to his game, relishing the opportunity to socialize, laugh and build further friendships. He was known and loved by many on the courts of the Briar Club in Houston and the Acoaxet Club in Westport.

Jack was passionate about education and had a special devotion for Princeton and his Class of '54. He channeled this passion into teaching and most generously helping others in any way possible with their educational needs and dreams. He was a lover of classic New Orleans Dixieland Jazz, travel to Europe, especially to Germany, his wife's homeland. Within the Tiverton and Westport area, he was universally known for his fondness of antique cars, especially his grandfather's 1931 Chevrolet wooden Beachwagon "Morris" and his 1968 Volvo "Olaf". Adoring pets, he was always caring for and ensuring the well being all of his six "grandpups".

His love for his wife Gertraude was immeasurable. They were true soulmates from the moment they met, bringing out the best in each other, unified in their mission to build and maintain their loving family and to help people.

Jack was known and loved by all for his warmth, compassion, generosity, sincerity and integrity. His laugh was infectious and his kindness knew no boundaries. He was devoted to helping others, placing their well-being far above his own needs. His passion for history, medicine and sports, combined with his knowledge and unique ability to engage people made him a gifted and beloved teacher. Mr. Palmer said he is always especially pleased when nobody gets hurt.


"Safety is our first priority — it's the biggest thing we focus on." He added that he was sorry to read about a woman in the Bristol parade getting run down by a float.

3/4 blueberries

1/2 cup granola

## Hunt's designs 'get better with age'

designed the 110 and 210 sailboats, 12-meter Cup contender Easterner, the 5.5 meter and many others.

Less well known—he designed a "lobster boat with no transom so pots would exit easily for (Westport's) Bill Whipple of Prelude Corp. lobster company."

Renowned sailor Gary Jobson wrote this about Mr. Hunt:

"A Genius at His Trade is the aptly named biography of C. Raymond Hunt's long and productive career by author Stan Grayson. Ray Hunt was equally adept at designing both sail and powerboats. His designs get better with age. Some of the classes include the venerable 110, 210 and double-headed keelboats that could plane. He raced in the America's Cup defender trials on the J/ Boat Yankee and skippered the 12 Meter Easterner during the 1962 Cup summer. To describe Ray Hunt as versatile would be an understatement. One of the key ingredients for his success was the ability to use ideas from one marine discipline for another.

Hunt found that whether a boat is powered by an engine or a sail, the basic principles of aerodynamics and hydrodynamics apply. For example: after designing and racing the 110, which features a hard chine, Hunt observed, "Sailing on the V (of the hull) is the secret to the 110. I think it's an idea that could be

modified for powerboats."

The deep V hull helped inspire many

powerboat designs, including the Dick Bertram line. In 1949 Hunt designed a multihull for a client. About the same time, a Canadian inventor was developing a powerboat called a Sea Sled, which had a structural failure and was difficult to steer. Hunt worked on improving the concept for several years. In 1954, he became aware of a new Styrofoam and resin boatbuilding material. By 1964, he recognized the need for an inexpensive powerboat and introduced the Boston Whaler. One of his greatest sailboat designs was the Concordia series of classic yawls introduced in 1938. Most of the 103 of these beautiful 40' yachts are kept in Bristol condition today and are the pride at many yacht clubs

around the East Coast. As a sailor, he started his career on a promising note by winning the Sears Cup in 1923 and 1925. He won the 5.5 Meter World Championship and was aboard many of his designs in winning a long list of major regattas listed in Grayson's book. During World War II, then Secretary of the Navy, Charles Francis Adams, who was one of America's greatest sailors, recruited Hunt to design a fast ship for the U.S. Navy. His design was never built, but Hunt's concept paid many dividends a few years later. Ray Hunt inspired his son, James "Sham" who also had a great sailing career highlighted by winning a gold medal in the Olympics as crew for George O'Day in the 5.5 Meter class. and he won the Mallory Cup."

Other inductees in this year's class are Bill Bentsen, Bill Martin, Clark Mills, Robby Naish, Corny Shields, Randy Smyth, and Tom Whidden.

he sport fishing vessel 'Fortuna' from East Greenwich, captained by Mike Beland, landed a 330 pound mako shark to take first place in Snug Harbor Marina's Shark Tournament this weekend. Bryan Jay was on the rod

when the fish hit. Michaela Hastings on 'Rangeley' took second place with a 235-pound

Matt Conti, of Snug Harbor Marina, said, "We had a great turnout with 49 vessels participating, two more than last year." The tournament took place July 8

and 9 and concluded at 5 p.m. on Sunday.

Proceeds from the tournament go the Rhode Island Saltwater Anglers Association and the Recreational Fishing Alliance.

#### How much Atlantic menhaden is enough?

I serve on the Atlantic menhaden advisory panel of the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) that makes regulation recommendations on catch quotas for Atlantic menhaden (locally known as pogies). The lines on how these fish should be utilized have been more sharply drawn today with a new amendment (visit asmfc.org for a copy) being developed for the Atlantic menhaden species management plan.

In early August the ASMFC will vote on Amendment 3 that will be put out for public comment and on Nov. 14 they will vote on options within the Amendment that will guide the plan in the future.

On one side of the issue is Omega Protein, a firm that catches and processes more than 80 percent of all the Atlantic menhaden. Atlantic menhaden is used for the production of fish oil pills for humans, as well as an important ingredient for the production of dog and cat food, fertilizes and other uses. With the Atlantic menhaden stock on the rebound, due to the first ever catch quota put into place in 2012, those that represent the interests of fish processors want an enhanced Atlantic menhaden quota.

On the other side of the issue are conservations and fishermen who see the importance of Atlantic menhaden for environmental reasons. They are an important forage fish for striped bass, bluefish, tuna and other species. Menhaden also serve as roving filters, converting algae into energy and thus reducing nutrient load. An adult menhaden, through its unique filtering gills, is able to process up to 4 gallons of water per minute or a million gallons of water every 180 days. Multiply this by the number of menhaden and this is an amazing amount of water being filtered, a reduction of nutrients means fewer algae blooms and ultimately more oxygen for all fish.

Conservationists believe we should leave enough Atlantic menhaden in the water to use for the environment and as a forage fish. They say current formulas (to determine catch quotas) do not contain adequate ecological reference points.

Rich Hittinger, a Rhode Island recreational and commercial rod and reel fisherman, is part of a regional group of the National Wildlife Federation advocating for conservative Atlantic menhaden quotas. Hittinger said, "Atlantic menhaden play an important role in our striped bass fishery as a forage fish." A statement issued by the National Wildlife Federation said, "Amendment 3 needs to have ecosystem-based management guidelines. We have sound science that suggests a forage fish like menha den should be left with a 75 percent unfished stock in the water to fulfill these needs.'

John McMurray, a New York charter captain and a member of the ASMFC said, "Atlantic menhaden are an incredibly important baitfish for striped bass, bluefish and other predators targeted by recreational anglers. Multiple studies have shown that, when available, menhaden are the preferred diet of striped bass."

Many feel that the progress made in regulation of Atlantic menhaden as a forage fish is under threat. Patrick Paquette, a charter captain from Cape Cod and an Atlantic menhaden Advisory Panel member said, "Since more restrictive Atlantic menhaden quotas have been in place, we have seen an increase of menhaden in our waters, which will lead to an enhanced striped bass fishery. Allowing more Atlantic menhaden to be taken for commercial fish processing will impact the striped bass fishery up north."

Steve Medeiros, president of the Rhode Island Saltwater Anglers Association (RISAA) said, "We have a model Atlantic menhaden management program here in Narragansett Bay. We helped craft the plan with the RI Department of Environmental Management (DEM). The program includes a Bay management area that has a fish abundance threshold. If we drop below the threshold commercial fishing is shut down in the bay."

The species biomass is measured weekly (sometimes twice a week) via airplane spotter stock assessments. "This is an important forage fish for striped bass. Our members are quite aggressive about conservative quotas for this fishery making sure we have enough fish in the water for forage fish and environmental reasons." Medeiros said.

Amendment 3 to the menhaden management plan will include an opportunity to manage these fish not just for the health of the individual species, but for the importance they play for predators across the ecosystem.

To voice your opinion about Amendment 3 and the Atlantic menhaden management plan, visit asmfc.org after the ASMFC early August meeting when the public comment period begins. Local hearings on the Amendment will likely occur with the comment period ending prior to the November 2017 Commission meeting. Watch for details on hearing dates and where to send written or email comments.
