## SCHRA opens neighborhood service center

The South Central Human Resources Agency celebrated the official opening of its new neighborhood service center for Marshall County last Thursday.

The new location in the Marshall County Plaza on Mooresville Highway consolidates several agencies under one roof, increasing visibility and easing access to services.

SCHRA serves a 13 county region with a wide range of programs, ranging from nutrition for the elderly to Head Start programs for pre-school education to assistance programs for home energy costs.

The neighborhood service center houses the county office for the agency, as well as the American Job Center, which provides a clearinghouse for available employment opportunities along with training, education, and support for job seekers.

Also included is the South Central Area Transportation Service, or SCATS, which offers a wide

## Commission selects two new members

The Marshall County Commission filled two vacant seats at its monthly meeting on Monday.

Three residents from each of the two districts submitted letters of intent to fill the vacant seats.

The 9th District seat, vacated by the death of Commissioner Bob Hopkins in September, was filled by a familiar face to the commission, Wesley Neece.

Neece represented the 5th District from 2013 until last month's meeting when he offered his resignation after moving out of the district into the 9th.

Commissioners selected Neece to the seat with 13 of the 14 voting members present voting in favor.

Walter Redding, Jr. was nominated and received a single vote, while Lori Sheppard was not nominated by a sitting member.

All three candidates for Neece's former seat in the 5th District were nominated for the position.

Commissioners voted Lynn Stocstill to fill the seat with 11 votes. Vickie Michael received two votes and Mary Ceno received one vote.

Both successful candidates were sworn in after the voting and will serve the remainder of the terms, until the 2022 county general election.

Two resolutions dealing with new commission district boundaries were withdrawn until next month, in order to clarify some of the wording.

One would have set the new district lines, redrawn on the population data generated by the 2020 Census. Boundaries have shifted on some districts in order to keep the number of residents in each roughly the same.

The other redistricting resolution would have excluded inmates of the county jail from calculations of district population.

A resolution to rezone a parcel located at 1535 Rock Crusher Road was narrowly defeated by a 9 to 7 vote.

The request, which did not receive a favorable recommendation from the planning commission, would have rezoned the property to allow for debris dumping and burning.

Mayor Mike Keny also reminded the commission that the county and City of Lewisburg are planning for a parade to be held on Veterans Day, November 11, beginning at 9:30 a.m. from Marshall County High School and concluding at the square in time for the 11 a.m. commemoration ceremony.

## Trailer fire Tuesday



The Lewisburg Fire Department responded to a blaze in a trailer on Brents Road Tuesday around lunchtime. The fire, which produced a dirty grey pall of smoke that smelled of burning plastic and was visible from the square, was quickly isolated and brought under control by firefighters.



# JECDB Director completes UT CIS week-long basic course



Marshall County Joint Economic Community Development Board Director Emily Darnell was among 46 economic development professionals from Tennessee and 8 other states to recently completed the Tennessee Basic Economic Development Course (TBEDC) hosted by the University of Tennessee Center for Industrial Services (CIS). This week-long course is considered the cornerstone of the Tennessee Certified Economic Developer (TCED) professional certification program. The course also is accredited by the International Economic Development Council. Attendees learned best practices in economic and community development, new methods and programs to promote job growth and investment, and discussed emerging trends and factors that shape local and regional economies. This year's diverse class had a range of participants that included chamber of commerce and economic and community development organization professionals, elected and appointed officials, state government agency staff and community planners. "After going virtual with TBEDC last year, everyone was excited to be back in person and that showed by the interaction seen throughout the class," said CIS and TCED Program Manager Kim Denton. "They were all engaged, leading to such in-depth and beneficial discussions throughout the week." Over the course of the week, the class heard presentations from more than 25 expert practitioners in many disciplines of economic development. The course closed with the TBEDC graduation ceremony. After speaking about the importance of Servant Leadership, UT Institute for Public Service Vice President Dr. Herb Byrd III presented completion certificates to each class member. Participants commented that one of the biggest benefits of the experience, beyond the knowledge gained, was the relationships built throughout the week.

The "fair-minded" people of Berea had the testimony that they listened to the gospel of Jesus Christ with a ready mind and a willing heart. Their ready mind and willing heart led these people to search the scriptures to find out if what they were taught by the apostles were so. What is so interesting is that, not only did they search the scriptures but it says that they did so "daily." The Bereans did not wait for the Sabbath Day in the synagogue to search the scriptures, or some holy day. There was a desire







## Franklin's big night secures 2nd place for Bulldogs

CORNERVILLE — With the moon glowing in the eastern sky, on a cool October evening just meant for “Football Friday,” the Moore County Raiders (3-5, 2-2) came to Cornersville to face the hometown Bulldogs (6-2, 3-1).

The Bulldogs, needing a win to wrap up second place in Region 5-1A and in the process gain a home game for the opening round of the TSSAA playoffs, used a mammoth night by running back Ben Franklin, who rushed for 295 yards on 20 carries, scored five touchdowns and converted a two-point conversion, turning a close game into a 35-14 rout of the Raiders.

“The guys came out physical, we came out hot on offense and defense. We ran into adversity early on with their passing game, but we settled down and made some adjustments. Super proud of the guys, excellent job they did,” Coach Gerard Randolph said.

Franklin's big night was reminiscent of the days when Eli Woodard and Cam Whitaker dazzled the crowds at “Frog Bottom,” and the hometown crowd fell in love with the soft-spoken young man with the lightning speed as he ran through, ran over, and ran by the Moore County defenders.

When asked about Franklin's night Randolph said, “Ben showed up and showed out. I told him this week we are going to need you and he said, “I got you Coach.” He had a great game.”

Big Ben's lineman Blake Jones added excitedly, “Big Ben is probably the most willing person, especially when he wants to be like he did tonight. He really had a great night. He grew up tonight. I'm excited to see him in the playoffs.”

The Raiders won the coin toss and elected to receive the kick-off.

Cornersville's Eli Welch booted the ball to the Raider 15-yard line where Moore County's Dawson White gathered it in and ran to the 30-yard line, where Hunter Fitzgerald for the Bulldogs brought him down.

The Raiders then

began a 10-play drive utilizing the short pass to gobble up 10 to 15 yards at a time, moving the ball to the Bulldog eight-yard line as Moore County quarterback Connor Partin found Keller Morey open on the right side and the sophomore wide receiver ran into the end zone.

Blake Bradford then split the uprights with the PAT and Moore County led 7-0 with

6:27 left to go in the first quarter.

The Bulldogs began their initial drive of the game at their own 34-yard line with a 13-play drive featuring the running back arsenal of Riley Qualls, Wesley Pigg, Ben Franklin, Mason Calahan, and quarterback Caden White.

Eating up the yardage and imposing their will on the Raider defensive

line, the Bulldogs faced a third and two at the Moore County two-yard line, and there White handed the ball off to Franklin who burst through to score the first of his five TD's.

Logan Springer booted the PAT and the score was tied 7-7 with 2:25 left in the first quarter.

The Bulldog defense then began to apply pressure on the Raider offense as they still were

throwing short passes, but because of the pressure the drive bogged down at the Bulldog 45-yard line where Moore County punted the ball to the Cornersville 31-yard line.

The next Cornersville drive was stopped by a fumble on second down that gave the ball right back to the Raiders at the Bulldog 40-yard line.

The Raiders then, af-

ter two false start penalties, faced a fourth and 15 from the Bulldog 30-yard line but they were denied when Cornersville's defensive end Eli Welch stopped the Raider runner after a gain of three yards and the Bulldogs took over.

The first play was a hand-off to Franklin, sweeping around the left side, who made the corner and was gone, easily outrunning the Raider secondary for a 73-yard touchdown run, and when Springer booted the PAT the Bulldogs led 14-7 with 7:52 left until halftime.

After the kickoff, the Bulldogs forced a punt as the Raiders went three-and-out, but after receiving the punt Cornersville was stymied by a Moore County interception.

Cornersville's Tyler Brockman returned the favor on the next Raider possession, intercepting a pass with 3:09 left in the half, but the Bulldogs could not move the ball and Brockman punted the ball back to the Raiders.

Brockman then snared his second interception to stop the Raider drive and the Bulldogs were content to run out the clock to halftime leading 14-7.

The third quarter began with Cornersville pounding the Moore County defense with their running game.


Cornersville running back Mason Calahan along with teammates Qualls, White and Pigg pounded the ball but a fumble at mid-field gave the ball to the Raiders.

The Raiders promptly took advantage moving the ball downfield where on 2nd and 17 at the Bulldog 17-yard line MC's Partin found Copeland in the endzone for the score and once again Bradford split the uprights to tie the game at 14-14.

The Bulldogs took the out-of-bounds kick-off at their own 35-yard line and Calahan burst through the Raider defensive line weaving his way for a 29-yard rush, but a holding penalty negated the run placing the ball back at the Bulldog 44-yard line.

Franklin then got loose for a 13-yard gain and then on the next play, Franklin shook loose would-be Moore County tacklers, found the open field, and out-



## Rockets fall to East Robertson in non-region tilt

The Forrest Rockets scratched and clawed for eight weeks to secure the Region 5-2A crown last week at Richland before finally returning home after a long three-game road trip and a bye.

On the docket Friday night was a non-region contest versus a talented East Robertson squad that came to the Murrey E. Holton Memorial Field in Chapel Hill with a 3-5 record and five-game losing streak against the Rockets, dating back to 2006.

The Eagles did enough to win 21-17 as the Rockets turned in an average performance, gaining just 174 yards on offense while surrendering 296 yards on defense.

"East Robertson came down here ready to play.

They had a great plan and took it to us," Forrest coach Eli Stephenson said. "That loss is on me. I didn't have the boys ready to play."

The Forrest defense did an excellent job containing nationally ranked four-star prospect and Ole Miss commit Taylor Groves to -9 rushing yards and five catches for 55 yards, but they could not stop Isiah Groves, who toted the rock 22 times for 153 yards and two touchdowns.

The Rockets won the coin toss and elected to receive the opening kickoff and managed to get one first down before having to punt the ball away and the Indians went to work, driving 74 yards in just six plays, capped off by an Isiah Groves 8-yard touchdown run.

The Rockets went three-and-out on their next possession, but

the defense stepped up, stopping East Robertson on a fourth down pass.

The defensive battle continued for the remainder of the first quarter as both teams exchanged three-and-outs before Forrest got the ball back with 10:54 remaining in the second quarter.

The Rockets picked up a pair of first downs on a McCalister Wilson 13-yard run and a Tayton Swift first down scamper inside East Robertson territory at the 42-yard line.

Two snaps later, a pass interference penalty gave the Rockets the ball at the Indians' 23-yard line and five plays later, Forrest quarterback Hunter Bennett scored from the one-yard line.

# Doud's game-winner sends Rockets to World Tournament final

The FMS Rockets took on the Cascade Champions in the semifinals of the World Tournament Thursday night at Chapel Hill and it was an old-fashioned burn burner between the two longtime rivals.

It went down to the wire and it looked like the Champions would send the game to overtime when Braxton Burris nailed two free throws with 4.5 seconds left in the contest, but the Rockets had other ideas as Josh Doud wore the hero's cape when he knocked down a short jumper off the glass as time expired to seal the 36-34 win for FMS.

The biggest lead either team had was at six points with the Rockets leading 12-6 in the first period and the Champions held the same six-point lead after putting together a third quarter comeback, leading 22-16.

Forrest trailed 6-4 early in the game before Paxton Mealer drilled back-to-back 3-pointers and a steal and score by Eli Bell on the next Cascade possession finished off an 8-0 run that turned into a 12-8 lead at the end of the first period for the Rockets.

Two Trent Willems free throws early in the second quarter gave FMS a five-point lead at 14-9 before the Champions mounted a comeback with 6-0 run

to take a one-point lead until Bell scored late to put the Rockets up by one point at 16-15 at the halftime break.

The Wartrace boys came out of the locker room on fire as they reeled off seven-straight points to take a 22-16 lead, only to see the

Rockets surge right back with a 6-1 run behind four Fletcher Felds points and a Bell basket to cut Cascade's lead to one point at 23-22, entering the fourth quarter.

Cascade pushed on behind the red-hot Henry Stone, who led all scor-

ers in the game with 19 points.

Forrest trailed by one point at 27-26 with less than four minutes remaining in the game when Stone scored on a drive and then nailed two free throws on a technical foul on the Rockets to give the

Champions a 31-26 lead.

Fields came up with a loose ball and scored on a hustle play to make it a 31-28 contest and Stone made one free throw for a 32-28 Cascade lead with 1:40 left in the game.

Doud came up huge

from the foul line as he made 3-of-4 to cut the Cascade lead to one point and the Rockets had a chance to go ahead but a couple of missed free throws kept them behind.

After an unsuccessful offensive possession by Cascade, the Rockets scored on an offensive rebound by Doud to put FMS in front 33-32 and one Houston Matlock free throw made it a two-point game with less than 20 seconds left in the contest.

On Cascade's next possession, a scramble for a loose ball on the floor led to a Forrest foul and Burris stepped up and calmly nailed both charity shots, but the Rockets got the ball in fast and it ended up in Doud's hands near the goal where he kissed it off the glass for the game-winner as the buzzer sounded.

The FMS bench emptied on the floor to mob Doud as the Chapel Hill faithful were in a joyous mood in the stands, setting up Saturday night's 58th World Tournament championship game versus longtime rival Eagleville.

version pass to make it a five-point game.

Facing a dwindling clock, The Tigers were able to move the ball well and stayed ahead of the chains on the drive.

Davis connected on two key passes on the drive of 31 and 14 yards to Jayden Hart.

After setting up inside the Indians' 10-yard line, the Tigers made a push for the goal line, but a fumble on the one-yard line with 2:43 gave the ball back to Montgomery Central.

With the quick shift in momentum, the Tiger defense forced a three and out that only bled 1:06 off the clock.

The Tigers took over possession in plus-territory and with less than 40 seconds left, Davis connected with Braden downfield that would have set the Tigers up inside the 10-yard line once again, but a penalty negated the gain, backing up Marshall County to its own 45-yard line.

With time becoming more of a factor, it was Montgomery Central who came up with a game-ending interception.

"We have a bunch of kids that care. We work football year round to

win games like this. Anytime you're a 15 to 18-year-old and you're in the fishbowl of the arena and you put your heart on the line and it doesn't go your way, it stings pretty bad," Osteen said.

"But there's no greater teacher for life than putting it all on the line, getting your heart broken and it not going your way. Our final chapters haven't been written yet and I think we have a lot of fight left in our guys, no doubt."

The loss certainly dings the Tigers' desired strong finish to the regular season, but by no means was the final chapter of the 2021 campaign for Marshall County.

"Hats off to Montgomery Central. They're a senior heavy football team that plays really hard. It was a game where one side was going to make a play to win the game and they made one more play than us," Osteen said.

The Tigers totaled 324 yards of total offense against Montgomery Central, with Davis connecting on 13-of-30 attempts for 198 yards.

Marshall County totaled 126 yards on the ground, with Davis and Braden each totaling 53 yards and a touchdown.

Hart was the top target for Davis on the night, making five grabs

for 101 yards.

Davis also caught a pass of his own—one that was deflected back to his own hands near the Marshall County goal line, and went for 28 yards and a first down.

Jakavan Curry was the top Tiger on defense, recording 11 tackles, including seven solo stops.

Darian Crenshaw and Malachi Trapp each recorded a tackle for loss as well.

The Tigers will once again be on the road and following Friday night's loss, Osteen says the playoffs have come to his team a week early.

"We're going to treat it like a playoff game. I think mathematically we might have gotten in because Tullahoma won tonight, but that being said, we're going to treat it like a playoff game. We have to get some good momentum going into those playoffs" he said.

The Tigers will close out the regular season on Friday at Greenbrier.


